1. An interview with the manager of the main office of the Northern Bank Limited, Belfast, reveals that a credit for ten pounds (£ 10) was given Capt. R. C. Henderson, O 478 792, AC, this organization, the Summary Court Officer in the case of 2nd Lt. Floyd (NMI) Smith, O 675 636. The Bank of England refused to honor the third five pound (£ 5) note, which was so damaged as to make identification impossible. This ten pounds (£ 10) was delivered to Capt Henderson and signed for by him on 29 April, 1944.

2. Capt Henderson forwarded the ten pounds (£ 10) to the Effects Quartermaster shortly afterwards.

3. As Capt Henderson is no longer at this station additional details are not available at the present time.

£15. Mutilated Bank of England Notes

Your letter dated 31 March 1944 to Captain R. C. Henderson, APO 635, U.S. Army, in respect of the £15. mutilated Bank of England notes, has been forwarded to this office for our reply.

We note that two of the £5. notes have been redeemed, and that the Bank of England has been unable to take one of the notes ---2277 unless the full number of this note can be obtained from the person who gave it to the deceased Pilot.

As you can well appreciate, this would be practically impossible, since as a rule individuals do not keep records of the serial numbers of bank notes, particularly in this case as the one person who might be able to furnish such information, namely, the owner of the notes, Lt. Floyd Smith, is deceased.

It should be called to your attention that Lt. Smith was killed in an aircraft accident, which will explain in all likelihood the reason for the mutilated notes.

In view of these facts it is desired that if possible further efforts be made to obtain collection of the £5. note in question. Should you be successful in this instance it is requested that you please make out a check for said amount payable to the Effects Quartermaster, ETOUSA.

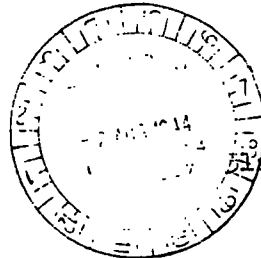

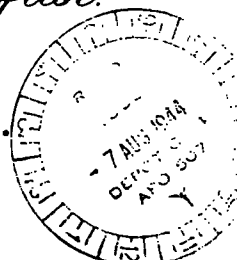

In reference to your letters of 7th and 27th July, we now have heard from our London Agents.

We quote their letter in full:-

## MUTILATED BANK OF ENGLAND NOTES.

"We are writing to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 16th ultimo, in regard to which we have been in communication with the Bank of England, and we give below an extract from their reply:

"(As you are aware it is the practice of the Bank of England to pay against an indemnity, only such of their notes in denominations of 35. and upwards as have been lost or mutilated where it is possible satisfactorily to establish the identity of the notes involved. In the particular circumstances the Bank would of course wish, if it all were possible, to meet the claim which has been made and it occurs to us, therefore, that, even though the deceased officer who was the owner of the note in question had no record of its number, it may be either that the Army Air Station to which he was attached might have some record of 35. notes which were paid out to the station personnel during the period immediately prior to his death, or that the Northern Bank Limited may be in a position to state what notes of this denomination were issued by them to the United States Army Air Force at about this time. Any information in this respect might well serve as a means, by the process of elimination, of arriving at the identity of the note, of which a fragment bearing part of the number is now in the possession of the Bank.

With regard to the suggestion that this Bank may have a record of the numbers of notes paid out, we regret to state that we cannot help you in this matter as it is not our practice to keep such a record.

1. Reference basic communication, the following information and statement is quoted by Tec 5 Alfred L. Corti, 32806194:

a. "The patrol led by Lt Robert J. Green O-1312842 skirted the southern edge of Gravelotte and proceeded down hill on a deeply rutted wagon road for about fifteen hundred (1500) yards east of Gravelotte to the edge of a wooded area. At this point and about 15 yards from the edge of the wooded area Lt Green was hit.

b. There were two permanent landmarks in the vicinity. One was a small brick building, either a power station or a booster station on the right of the wagon road about six hundred (600) yards from Gravelotte and nine hundred (900) yards from the edge of the wooded area. Another permanent landmark was a steeple of a church which was clearly visible and about one thousand (1000) yards in a northeastern direction from the place where Lt. Green was hit.

c. There is a possibility that Lt Green may have been buried by civilians, or his body might have been dragged into the wooded area for examination by the Germans."

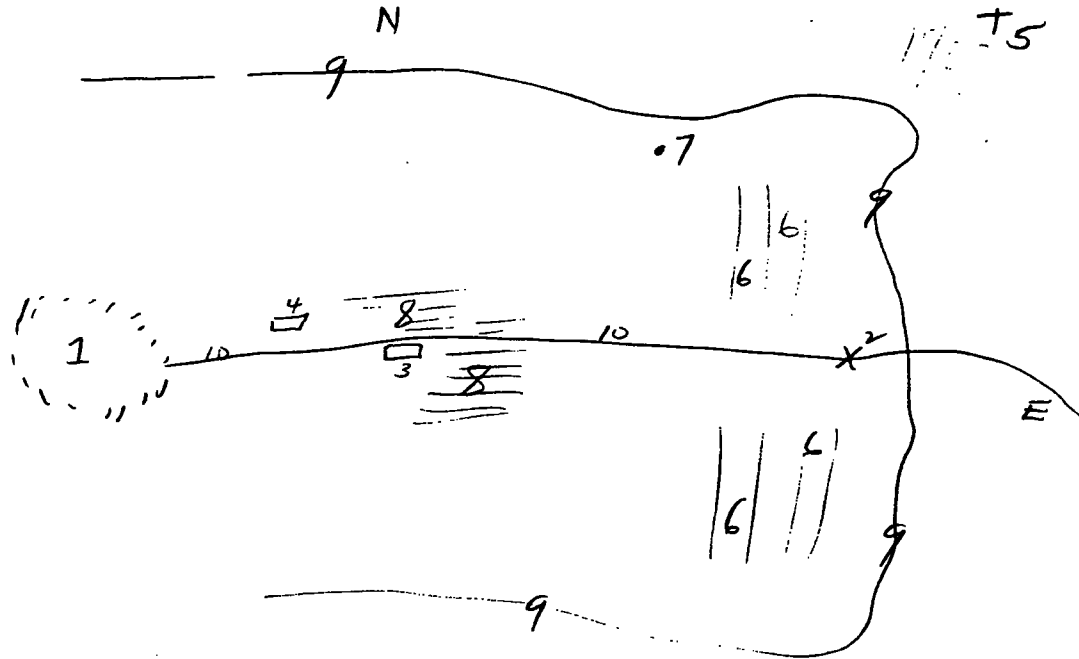

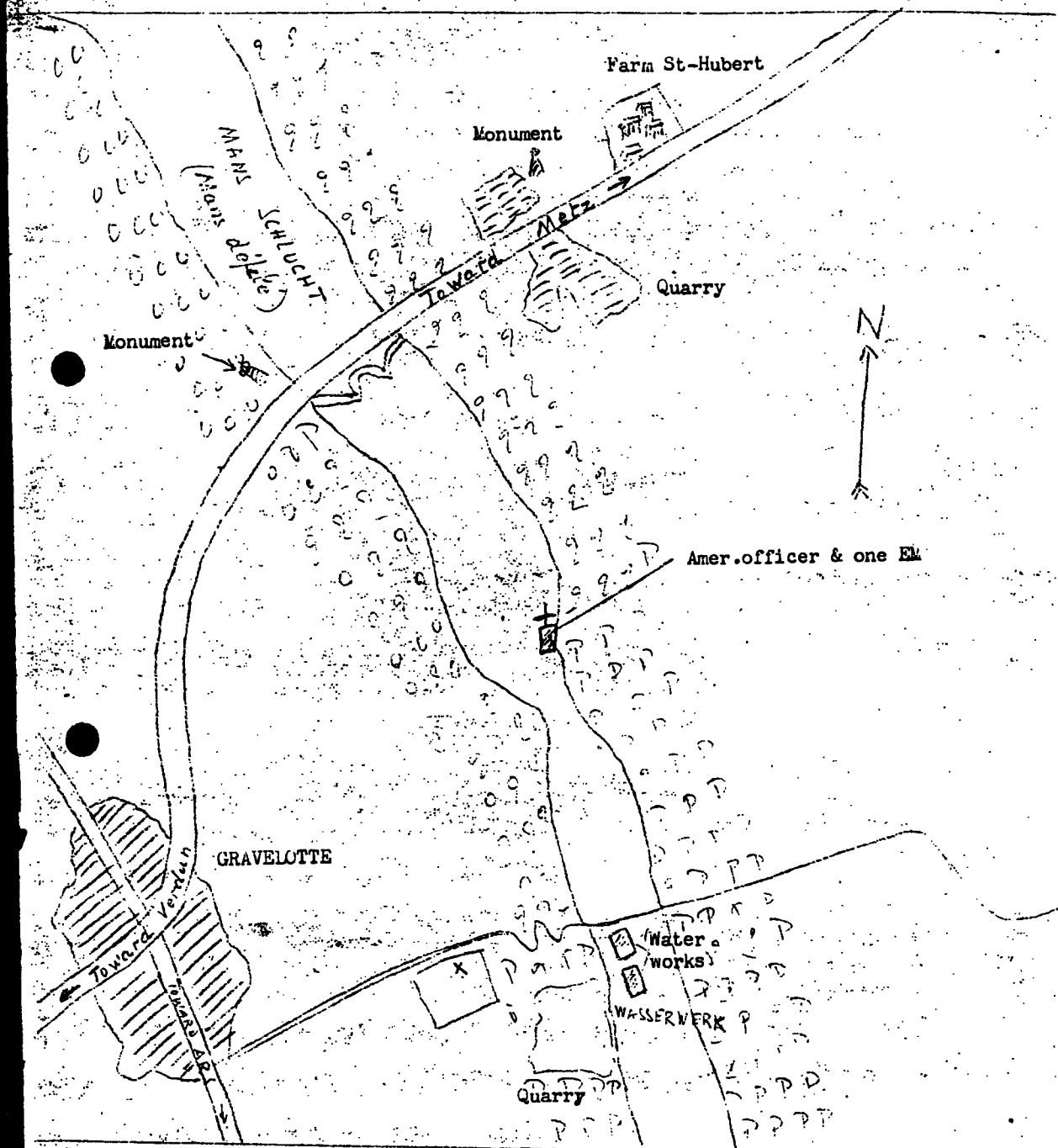

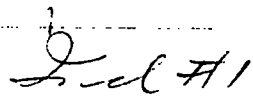
