I. - FACTS

1. The following named persons, members of two crews assigned to 448th Bombardment Group, 713th and 714th Bombardment Squadrons, respectively, have been carried on War Department records as missing in action over France, in flying pay status, since 27 June 1944, as reported on Shipments ETO 118 and 120:

- 2. Confidential Missing Air Crew Reports, No. 6726 and No. 6728, dated 30 June 1944, list the above named personnel as crew members aboard two B-24 (H) aircraft, serial numbers, 42-50369 and 41-29004, respectively, which departed Seething, England, 27 June 1944 on a bombing mission to Creil, France. The aforementioned reports state that weather conditions and visibility were clear at the time of departure; that information as to time or location of last known whereabouts of missing aircraft or crew members is not available; that circumstances surrounding their disappearance are unknown and that neither craft was identified by other members of this Group.
- 3. Filed in the respective AG 201 files of Staff Sergeant Carr and Edgeant Skledar, is Casualty Information forwarded by 2nd branner Indorsement from Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, U. S. Army, dated 16 and 27 Swotember 1944, respectively, to TAG. This information which is signed by First Lieutenant Benedict Corsiglia, Adjutant, for the Commander of the 713th Bombardment Squadron, and Captain James E. Chancellor, Adjutant, for the Commander of the 714th Bombardment Squadron, is quoted below:
 - " * * * S/Sgt Carr was flying as Right haist Gunner. Lst It.
 Seymour Jarol was bilot of the crew which was * * * on mission to Criel, France. No one saw the ship leave the formation."
 - " * * * Sgt. Skledar's crew * * * was missing after bombing mission over Griel, France * * *. This station has no information as to the damage to the aircraft or fate of the crew as no one saw the plane go down * * *."
- 4. Filed in Lieutenant Jarol's AG 201 file is Casualty Information forwarded by 2nd Wrapper Indorsement, Headquarters, European Theater of Operations. U. S. Army, dated 3 August 1944, to TAG, which reports that Lieutenant Jarol's aircraft was not observed by either pilots or crews of the 448th Group.
- 5. Filed in Dicutement Vilson's AG 201 file is the copy of a letter, dated 16 September 1944, from Personnel and Transing Division, Air Corps, to The Adjutant General's Office, which states that its, Wilson received a card from Lieutement Vilson mailed from Chicago 9 September 1944, in which he stated that he was enroute to the 18th Replacement Ling, Salt Lake City, Utah. Official reports from Fort Douglas, Utah, from OH Omaha, Nebraska and Young COAAF, Lincoln, Nebraska to WD and TAG, received 13 and acceptable 1944, respectively, give the following information:
 - " * * * 13th Reel Wing * * * now le ted at Lincoln, New Atta. * * * "

- " * * * 18th Repl Wing disolved."
- " * * * Latest info Lt. Charles W. Wilson 0704863 indicates * * * APO 16001 BJ115 Care Postmaster New York City N Y "
- 6. Hearsay evidence contained in a letter from Mrs. Mary Savo to TAG, received 5 April 1945 and filed in Sergeant Savo's 201 file, alleges that 42-50369 aircraft experienced engine trouble and that parachutes were seen. A letter dated 27 January 1945, filed in Sergeant Prior's AG 201 file, from Mrs. Prolya Prior to TAG is herewith quoted in part:

"From Mrs. Jarol, mother of the bilot, 1st Lt. Seymour Jarol, I received this information.

'The plane was sighted leaving the formation and was not on fire. It has been assumed that they had engine trouble and were forced down somewhere in enemy territory and are either in hiding or prisoners.'

" * * * The other letter I got was from Savo's mother. * * *

'A friend of Savo's had gone to the Red Cross in England and had * * * unofficial news that was very good. * * * He said, * * * the goys' situation was good and that the end of the war would see them home again.'

- 7. Seething, England, the point of departure, is located ten miles southeast of Norwich in Norfolk. Creil, France, is six miles northwest of Senlis and approximately twent-five miles north and east of Paris.
- 3. An examination of the files of these persons, whose status is herein under consideration, in Casualty, Officens' and Enlisted Branches, AGO, and the index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, PAGO, reveals no additional information relevant to this review.

II. - CONCLUSIONS

- 1. The personnel listed in Part I, paragraph 1, above, were crew members aboard two B-24 (Liberator) aircraft which departed Seething, England, 27 June 1944, on a bombing mission to Creil, France, from which they failed to return.
- 2. Hearsay evidence, that the boys' situation was good and that the end of the war would see them home again, is not corroborated by official report or by fact. Twelve months have elapsed since they became missing in action and "The end of the war" has come, but they have not been seen or heard from by anyone.
- 3. The postcard received by Mrs. Wilson was undoubtedly written by Li. Wilson en route to the 18th Replacement Wing, Salt Lake City, Utcl. and may have been given, for mailing, to a passenger detraining at Chicago, but owing to human frailty was not mailed until 9 September 1944.
- 4. Hearsay evidence, notwithstanding, official reports are unanimous in stating that no one saw the plane leave the formation; no one knows the circumstances surrounding the disappearance of the aircraft or crew members, and there is no information as to damage to the aircraft or the fate of the crews.
- 5. In view of the foregoing facts and circumstances, it is concluded that the persons, whose status is herein considered, may not reasonably be presumed to be living, within the meaning of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act.

III . RECOM & WIION

It is recommended that the sefindings of death be made under the provisions consection 5 of the Missing Persons act in the cases of the persons named in

S. R. & D. No. 3330

Part I, paragraph 1, above, and that these findings show the presumed date of death, in each case, to be 28 June 1945.

SYNOPSIS OF CASE: The above comprised the entire crew of A/C #41-29004, which, on 27 June 1944, departed England on a mission to Creil, France. Causes for this planes disappearance are unknown. An extensive field investigation conducted at the target area and surrounding places proved negative. The planned course of flight of this aircraft would have taken it over the English Channel. In view of the above and the time that has elapsed since the missing flyers have neither been seen nor heard from, it can be concluded that A/C #41-29004 either crashed into the British Channel or exploded in mid-air.

Reference is made to MACR G-168 and to Narrative dated 28 June 1947.

2. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in US Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials.

3. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research; be declared non-recoverable.

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NARRATIVE

This special investigation was directed in an effort to find the scene of the crash of Λ/C #004, last reported over Creil (Oise) and to locate the remains of the missing crew.

This area has been searched previously and from Gendermerie records for this area, it was ascertained that no American plane fell here on 27 June 1944 (ltr #1).

This investigator next contacted the Gendermerie Company for the entire department of Oise at Beauvais for information on this plane. Here it was learned that this particular plane was not listed in their records, but in order to avoid any error, the Commander agreed to contact each one of his brigades to make sure that this crash had not been overlooked. The results of his search will be forwarded to this headquarters by return mail.

The Dulag Luft records were next consulted. Of the three Liberators which crashed on 27 June 1944, not one can be Λ/C #004. The crew members of these three planes listed by the Germans were all identified.

11 July 1947

The Gendermerie report from Beauveis for Oise received this date lists three American planes downed on 27 June 44. One crew is fully identified (ltr $\frac{\pi}{2}$), and the other two crews were buried in the Creil cometery.

15 July 1947

A visit to the Creil cemetery revealed (ltr $\frac{n}{n}$ 3) that the first crew buried here was American and identified. The other crew was R.A.F. No other plane is listed as being brought down on this date.

Since the wreckage of this plane cannot be found, it is logical to assume that it crashed in the English channel.

No other clues as to its disappearance are presently available.

In view of these facts, this case should be considered closed until new information is made available.

- 2. Missing fir Crew Report No. 6728, dated 30 June 1944, names the subject persons as the complete crew of B-24 aircraft No. 41-29004, of the 714th Bombardment Squadron, 448th Bombardment Group, which failed to return to base in England from a bombing mission to Creil, France, 27 June 1944. The Report indicated that the aircraft was not identified by other members of the Group, and that no information in regard to it was available.
- 3. A report from Headquarters, 714th Bombardment Squadron, found in the AG 201 file of Sergeant Skledar, states: "This station has no information as to the damage to the aircraft or fate of the crew as no one saw the plane go down."
- 4. In the .G 201 file of Sergeant Skledar is a letter dated 3 February 1945, from his mother, from which the following is quoted:

"I am enclosing a letter I received from a bor only son's base who, when their plane failed to return questioned the others to find out what had happened to Joe's plane.

"He was told that two motors had been shot out of the plane but that it had left formation under control. The Conway family received a similar letter from another Lt., a friend of their sons."

The letter was returned to Mrs. Skledar, and a notation was made in the file to the effect that it contained no information of walue to Status Review and Determination Section.

- 5. No information regarding the subject plane or any member of its crew has been found in captured German records.
- 6. Information has been received from Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General, that there are no favorable associations for any of the subject persons among the unknown dead found in the Creil, France, area, or washed ashore from the English Channel. The case has now gone to the Non-Recoverable Unit of that office, for appropriate action.
- The officers and enlisted men named in paragraph 1, above, were members of the crew of a Liberator bomber which took off from a base in England on a bombing mission to Creil, France, on 27 June 1944, and failed to return. The report that the plane left the formation under control appears to be mere rumor, in view of the Hissing Air Crew Report, which distinctly states that the plane was not identified by other members of the Group, and the later report, from the Squadron Headquarters, that there was no information as to the damage to the aircraft or fate of the crew. Creil, the target, is approximately 25 miles north, and slightly to the east, of Paris, and about 70 miles from the coast. The American Graves Registration Command has found no trace of any member of this crew, nor has information regarding any of them been found in captured German records. It is concluded that the information of record in the Department of the Army at this time does not warrant the issuance of official reports of death pursuant to the provisions of Section 9 of the Missing Persons Act.


