DATE OF DEATH : 16 December 1943.

SYNOPSIS OF CASE: The above named twenty men formed the crews of two B-17's which departed England to bomb Bremen, Germany. Weather was recorded as being sub-zero. The course chartered took the two planes over the North Sea, coming in to Bremen from the North. A/C No. 113 was attacked by enemy aircraft and one engine was knocked completely off the ship, falling on A/C No. 872. Both planes went down at 52:10N - 05:20E, a location in the Wadden Zee, approximately eight miles from the west coast of Holland. No chutes were seen. No further word has been heard regarding these two A/C or their crews. The fact that they are not mentioned in captured enemy records (Holland being occupied territory at the time); and the fact that a detailed survey of the Dutch Coast by field teams resulted in failure to find trace of planes or crews - all leads to the conclusion that the above named twenty men were drowned in the North Sea and will not be recovered.

Reference is made to Determination of Status Report by AG Casualty and to letter from First Zone dated 8 August 1947.

- 2. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this Headcuarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.
- 3. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.

"Aircraft No. 42-30872 went down near 5310N-0520E after being hit by one engine falling off aircraft No. 42-3113. Aircraft No. 42-3113 was attacked by enemy aircraft on an operational mission to Bremen, Germany on 16 December 1943: The crew consisted of the following personnel: * * * * . No chutes were seen."

The coordinates 53°10'N 05°20'E locate a point over the Waddon Zoc, approximately two miles northwest of Harlingen, Holland.

c. The AG 201 file of Sergeant Donald R. DENMEAD contains a photostatic copy of a postcard, dated 27 April 1944, from Staff Sergeant George B. Strauss, a prisoner of war of the German Government, to his sister, Miss Wynne Strauss, 3416 N. Marshfield Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. The pertinent part of his message reads as follows:

"DENMEAD was killed in action in Dec."

An examination of Visi-card records of the Casualty Branch shows a Staff Sergeant George B. Strauss, 16096952, whose mother lives in Chicago, Illinois, as missing in action on 26 July 1943 and who was reported as a prisoner of war of the German Government on a report received 14 August 1943.

12.According to Official War Department sources, a large force of B-17 and B-24 aircraft with strong escort bembed Bremen, Germany, through a 10/10 overcast on 16 December 1943. High explosive and incondiary bembs were dropped with unobserved results.

13. The AF 201 files and the Casualty Branch files of these officers and enlisted men have been examined. Nothing of value to this review was found, other than that set forth above.

14. Momorial Division, OQMG, and the Frisoner of War Division, PMGO, in response to requests from this office for any information bearing on the status of these officers and enlisted mon, indicated that they had no record of them. In the case of the officers, Officer's Branch, AGO, in response to a similar request, stated that they were missing in action on 16 December 1943.

15. Those officers and enlisted mon have not been reported as prisoners of war or internees. They have not returned to duty.

II. - CONCLUSIONS

l. The status of forty-five members of the crews of eight planes lost in the Bremen raid on 16 December 1943 is the subject of this review. As shown in the statement of facts above, each of the eight Fortresses carried a crew of ten, a total of eighty officers and men. Thirty-five of the eighty have been accounted for—twenty-six are dead and nine are pri-

The loss of this plane near the Dutch coast was due to a collision with aircraft No. 42-30872. (See paragraph 5, below.)

b, The Service Records of all the above-named enlisted men contain the notation that the plane was lost at 53°07'N, 05°12'E, a location in the Wadden Zee, approximately eight miles from the west coast of Holland.

c. On 6 October 1944, this office requested the Commanding General, U.S.F., European Theater of Operations, to furnish any additional information then available concerning the loss of this plane and the disappearance of the crow. The pertinent part of the 4th Indorsement, dated 24 October 1944, from Headquarters 96th Bombardment Group, reads as follows:

"Aircraft No. 42-3113 was on an operational mission to Bremen, Germany on 16 December 1943, when aircraft was attacked by enemy aircraft. One engine was knocked completely off ship, falling on aircraft No. 42-30872. Both ships went down at Dutch coast near 5310N-0520E. The crow consisted of the following personnel: * * * * * * No chutes were seen."

The coordinates 53°10'N, 05°20'E locate a position over the Waddon Zee approximately two miles northwest of Harlingen, Holland.

sonors of war. (For other personnel missing on this same raid, see S.R. & D. 1803 on file in Mail and Message Section, Casualty Branch.)

- 2. The circumstances surrounding the loss of these crows have not been completely reported for the apparent reason that, in an operation on the scale of this raid, accurate observation of what happened to each plane was impossible.
- 3. It is quite definitely established that four of the crews went down in the Wadden Zee, off the northwest coast of Holland; three crews were last seen near the Dutch coast; one was last seen in western Germany. Crew No. 1 was attacked by enemy fighter planes and one engine of their plane was knocked completely off, falling on the plane of crew No.2. Both planes crashed and two locations, both in the Wadden Zee, were given as the scene of the casualty. No one was seen to parachute from cither of these two planes and all members of each crew are still carried as missing in action.

8. In view of the foregoing, together with the fact that twolve months have elapsed during which period those officers and enlisted men have not been seen or heard from by anyone, it appears that they may not reasonably be presumed to be living.

III. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that findings of death be made under the provisions of Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, in the cases of the officers and onlisted men named on the attached list, and that these findings show 17 December 1944 as the presumed date of death.

The loss of this plane was due to a collision with aircraft No.42-31113. (See paragraph 4 above.)

b. Sorgeant HAYNE'S AG 201 file contains a letter, dated 26 July 1944, from his mother with an inclosure, a photostatic copy of a letter, dated 18 July 1944, from Mrs. Edna Carpenter, the mother of Lieutenant KERRICK. The pertinent part of Mrs. Carpenter's letter reads as follows:

"The boy I have waited for has finally come home from England. He wrote to me on July 8th, Lewis's twenty-fifth birthday. Ever since his letter came I have tried to decide whether or not to pass on the message he sent me. My final decision has been to go on the assumption that, like myself, you would want to know what happened. I shall quote from Bob's letter.

"Doar Hom: - I just got that beautiful letter that you wrote to mo."

'Mom, right off I am going to give you both barrels. I'll tell you what follows teld me they saw. I wasn't there but this is the best I can do.

"Horky Hondrickson's plane got a direct hit. He went out of control and crashed into Low. They both blow up. It happened just off the enomy coast over the North-Sea. No one got out of either ship. * * * * *"

- c. No record was found in Visi-card files of Casualty Branch showing a Hendrickson as a casualty on 16 December 1943 in this area.
- d. On 6 October 1944, the Commanding General, U.S.F., European Theater of Operations, was requested to furnish this office any additional information concerning the loss of this plane and the disappearance of the crow. The pertinent part of the 4th Indorsement, dated 24 October 1944, from Headquarters, 96 th Bombardment Group, is quoted below:

Realizing the extent of your grief and anxiety, I deeply regret that I have no alternative but to convey this information to you.






- 1. Attached and made a part hereof is a list of forty-five officers and enlisted men entitled: "U.S. Army Air Forces Personnel Missing in Actions 16 December 1943, Following a Bombing Raid on Bremen, Germany."
- 2. These officers and enlisted mon were reported missing in action while in flying pay status on 16 December 1943, by USSOS London, on classified messages numbered W 9421, dated 24 December 1943, and 26 December 1943, respectively (Casualty Branch Nos: 358083 and 361019). These messages also showed the crew position for each individual.
- 3. Missing Air Crew Reports reporting the circumstances of the loss in each case have been submitted by the respective organizations of the officers and enlisted men named above. According to these reports, they were on a bembing mission to Bremen, Germany, on 16 December 1943. The weather conditions and visibility were described as follows: "Weather: Sub-zero. Visibility: At 23,000 ft, unrestricted. Target obscured." The reports, with the exception of AAF No. 1558, state that the course of the flight was "Base to Ely to Newmarket to Gremer to 5303-0143E to 5430-0640E to 5340-0845E to 5326-0920E to Target". This course was over the North-Sea, coming in to the Target, Bremen, from the North. The reports also set forth the complete crew of each plane and a summary of the facts surrounding that plane's disappearance. The following paragraphs, 4 to 11, inclusive, set forth the pertinent facts from all sources concerning each individual crew. The status of each crew member has been obtained from Visi-card records of the Casualty Branch.


