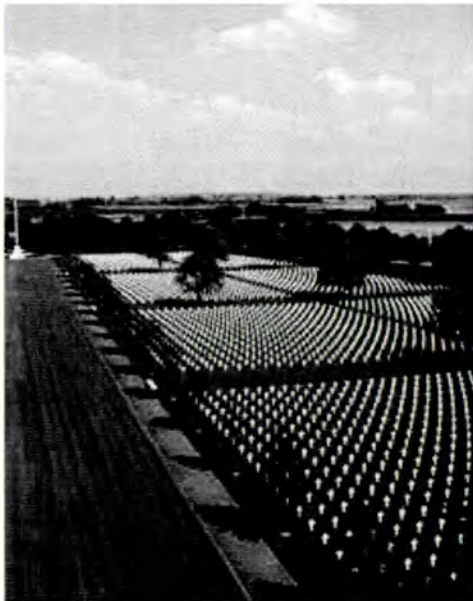

PLACE OF DEATH: North Sea, Off Northern Coast of Langeegg Island (German Frisian Islands)

SYNOPSIS OF CASE: The above are the only unaccounted for crew members of a ten man crew from B-17-F aircraft #42-29750 which became lost on a bombing mission to Emden, Germany, on 27 September 1943. The aircraft was last sighted at an altitude of 24,000 feet, just after leaving the target with one engine on fire. The aircraft left the formation, dropped its bombs, heading down in a dive. One chute was observed. Two crewmembers (2nd Lt. Perritt and 2nd Lt Rolfe) washed ashore at the Northern beach of Langeegg Island on the same day. The plane wreckage was found near the shore of this island and evacuated by German Luftwaffe. No further information is available. It is believed that subject airmen drowned in the North Sea when their aircraft crashed and that their bodies have to date not been recovered.

Reference is made to OOMG Forms 371 (six men); MACR; 2 Dulag Records A.V. 320/43.

2. All attached supporting documents are copied from records in file headquarters American Graves Registration Command.

3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U. S. Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.

4. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.

On 27 September 1943, about 1700, at northern beach of Langeoog Island between dummy airport barracks and Schlageter-Memorial the dead body of a member of the American Airforce was recovered and handed over to Airbase Detail Langeoog by soldiers of the 2nd light Flak Training Unit. The body was not yet stiff and it is presumed that the death had occurred on the same day. The body was uninjured. An identification tag with following inscription was found: Frank O. ROLFE

O-678 669 T 43

Mr C.O. Rolfe

Adams Ave, Huntsville, Ala.

The tag was secured and will be handed over to Dulag Luft, Oberursel, together with the other items.

The body has been interred on 28 September 1943, at Langeoog Cemetery Duenenfriedhof, 1st row, grave #13.

To No. 2

On 27 September 1943, about 1900, at beach of Langeoog Island near the swimming beach the body of a member of the American Airforce was washed ashore and recovered by members of the German Navy and handed over to Airbase Detail Langeoog.

The body was not yet stiff and it is presumed that the death had occurred on the same day. The body was uninjured. The dead was dressed with a light-gray trouser (with the inscription "Perritt"), a green woolen jacket, and light-green flying suit. The Mark "P 5101/L-120" were found on the trousers and pants. An identification tag was not found. All secured items including roster were sent to Dulag Luft, Oberursel, for further evaluation.

The dead has been interred on 28 September 1943 at Langeoog Duenenfriedhof, 1st row, grave No. 14.

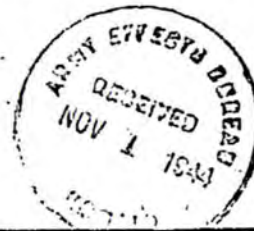
