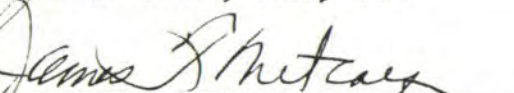

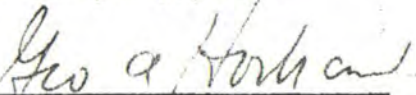

STATEMENT OF INVESTIGATION

25 September 1947

1. A routine check was made of the following pertinent sources of information in the Memorial Division:

- a. A - 2 Unit of the Records Section
- b. 333 cards
- c. Identification Section:
 - (1) Clue index
 - (2) Card file of identified unknowns
- d. 293 file of each individual whose status is the subject of the attached Report of Findings
- e. 293 file of T/Sgt. Barnett H. Goodman, 35285949, the only crew member whose body has been recovered.

No information was developed from any of the above sources inconsistent with that set forth in the Report of Findings.

2. The status of each of the individuals considered herein was changed by The Adjutant General's Office from that of presumed dead as of 30 July 1944 to that of killed in action 29 July 1943 based upon the physical factors of the crash, which circumstances have been set forth in the Report of Findings.

3. In view of the evidence contained in the attached Report of Findings submitted by the Overseas Board, coupled with the negative check of all pertinent sources available to OCMG, it is concluded that further investigation in this case is not warranted.

DATE OF DEATH : 29 July 1943.

SYNOPSIS OF CASE : The above mentioned ~~three~~^{ten} men formed part of crew of a B-17 which departed England on a mission to Warnemunde, Germany. On the return trip, within a few miles of English coast, another A/C from another group collided with the plane in question just behind the turret. At an altitude of 3,000 feet, the collision was serious enough to cause subject A/C to break up and fall in flames into the water. A search was made by Air Sea Rescue but without results. Although the accident was said to have taken place 2 miles off Cromer, England, the body of one crew member (Goodman) was washed ashore 2 days later nearly 50 miles away.

Reference is made to 4th Indorsement from 96th Bomb Group dated 12 May 1944, 1st Indorsement from Hq. ETOUSA dated 21 May 1944 and Determination of Status report of AG Casualty.

2. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.

1. The following officers and enlisted men of the 96th Bombardment Group, 338th Bombardment Squadron were reported missing in action off the English Coast since 29 July 1943 by Battle Casualty Reports 314 and 317, dated 3 August 1943 from your headquarters. No report has been received showing any change in their status, therefore, the War Department is now considering their cases in order that a determination of status, under the provisions of Section 5, Public Law 490, as amended, may be made:

2. It is requested that this office be furnished all available facts and circumstances surrounding the disappearance of the above listed personnel. Missing Air Crew Report states that these men and one other, Technical Sergeant Barnett H. Goodman, 35,285,949. comprised the crew and one passenger of B-17 F airplane, number 43-30370 and that it was lost as a result of a collision with a B-17 airplane from the 388th Bombardment Group. The Missing Air Crew Report names three witnesses who "saw crash" but does not show exactly where the crash occurred or how far off the English coast the plane came down. Answers to these and the following questions should be given, if possible: Did any of the personnel abandon the aircraft by parachute? How long did the plane float? Was any search or rescue effort made? What was the result of the search?

3. Captain Francis S. Madson, 0-417034, 45th Combat Wing, is listed as an eye-witness of the crash and, if practicable, a statement should be obtained from him.

1. The personnel listed in basic communication comprised the eleven man crew of aircraft number 42-30370, which was reported "Missing in Action " on 29 July 1943.

2. Subject aircraft was flying in the Lead Air Division position of the formation, when a plane of 338th Bombardment Squadron rose from a formation beneath and collided with subject aircraft, just behind the turret in which T/Sgt. Barnett H. Goodman, 25285949 was flying. The aircraft broke up and hit the water in flames, two miles East of Cromer (52036' N- 01021' E). One parachute was observed leaving the aircraft.

3. The body of T/Sgt. Goodman was washed ashore and identified by members of his command. A search was made by Air Sea Rescue, with no results. The time the subject aircraft remained afloat is known.

4. Captain Francis S. Madison, O-417034, referred to in the basic communication as an eye witness of the collision, states that he did not see the crash, but other members of his crew did witness it. None of these members are available for a statement.

5. Records of this headquarters indicate the status of all crew members of subject aircraft as "Missing in Action" on 29 July 1943, except that of T/Sgt. Goodman, which is "Killed in Action" on 29 July 1943.

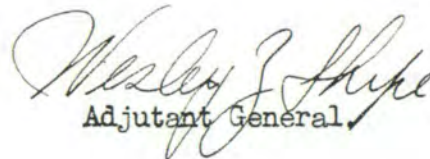

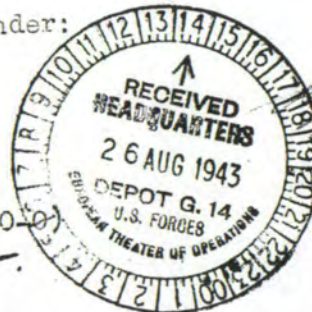
