In accordance with instructions in letter Hq AGRC, dated 23 September 1947, file RRE 293.9 (IB), subject Isolated Burials, case # 2429, the undersigned with combined search and disinterring team # 2 and Russian Escort Officer, Lt. Kurdukoff, arrived at Vollradisroda, Germang (M 51/J 66; 1/250,000) at 1140 hours 31 March 1948 to investigate.

The burgermeister of Dobrtischen and civilian Herr Lorenz at Vollradisroda were contacted and the cemetery records were examined. (See attached statement of Herr Lorenz and extract of cemetery records).

It was reported that at about 1100 hrs on 16 Aug 1944 an American plane exploded in the air near the village of Vollradisroda (M 51/J 66). One parachute was seen to open and the flyer reached the ground safely and was taken prisoner. Eight bodies were found in the vicinity of the plane crash. These bodies were picked up by the civilians of the village and buried in caskets in a common grave in the village cemetery. The cemetery records show the names as appear on MACR # 8436 and the order in which they were buried (see attached extract of cemetery records) as well as ASN's of seven of the deceased.

It is concluded that this is the grave of the eight casualties in subject case.



I am writing to you in reference to your son who gave his life in the service of his Country during the European conflict.

In an effort to furnish the next of kin with all available details concerning casualties emong our personnel, the Army Air Forces recently completed the translation of several volumes of captured German records.

In regard to Staff Sergeant William D. Dunn, these records indicate that he was killed 16 August 1944, when the B-17 (Fortress) he was abourd sustained damage from enemy antimircraft fire and crashed at Follradiaroda, which is located about twenty-five miles southwest of Effurt, Germany. These records also state that his body was interred 18 August 1944, Grave Humber 4, in the southeastern corner of the Cemetery of Vollradiaroda.

The Quartermaster General in his capacity as Chief, American Graves Registration Service, is charged with the responsibility of notifying the legal next of kin concerning grave locations of members of the military forces who are killed or die outside the continental limits of the United States. If the report of your son's burial has not been confirmed and you have not been notified by the Quartermaster General, that official will furnish you definite information immediately upon receipt of the official report of interment from the Commanding General of the Theater concerned.

May the knowledge of your son's valuable contribution to our cause sustain you in your bereavement.

I am inclosing a check for \$32.01, representing funds which belonged to him. The remainder of the property is being forwarded to you in one carton. A medal which was awarded him is being sent you under spearate cover, by registered mail.

If, by any chance, the property has not reached you at the expiration of thirty days from this date, please notify me and tracer action will be instituted.

The action of this Bureau in transmitting personal effects does not, of itself, west title in the recipient. Such property is forwarded for distribution according to the laws of the state of the soldier's legal residence.

I regret the circumstances prompting this letter, and wish to express my sympathy in the less of your son.
