Dear Mrs. Harvey:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, the central address of which is Room 713, 1712 "G" Street, N. W., Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interment activities are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. However, upon completion thereof, due notice will be carried by the press.

You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

Dear Mrs. Harvey:

We have received the "Request for Disposition of Remains Form" in regard to the final interment of the remains of your son, the late First Lieutenant Robert M. Leveridge.

Although understanding your natural interest in the future status of the United States Military Cemetery Brookwood, England, where the remains of your son now rest, I must inform you that this cemetery has not been designated as a permanent American Military Cemetery for our heroic dead of World War II.

Therefore, all remains presently interred in this cemetery will be carefully disinterred and either transferred to the nearest American Military Cemetery at Cambridge, England or returned to their Homeland. Please rest assured, however, that the entire journey will be accomplished under the care of trained personnel, with the dignified and solemn respect due our honored dead.

All necessary arrangements for burial, military honors and religious services will be completed and provided by the Government. Please rest assured that although you have no responsibilities and cannot be present, every detail will be accomplished with all the reverence and dignity traditional for our honored dead.

You will receive notification of the date of burial and the exact location of the grave. The flag used to drape the casket of your son during the burial ceremony will also be sent to you.

Each year on Memorial Day, Armistice Day, and other special anniversaries every grave of our honored dead in a National Cemetery in the United States or an American Military Cemetery overseas is appropriately decorated by the Department of the Army with flowers and a small American flag.

Dear Mrs. Harvey:

Reference is made to the "Letter of Inquiry - Disposition of Remains" sent to you about 30 days ago, requesting you to complete and mail the "Request for Disposition of Remains" form to this office.

The War Department is obliged to inter in permanent U. S. Military Cemeteries the remains of World War II Dead whose next of kin do not request their return to the United States for final burial. After burial in a permanent American Military Cemetery overseas, the next of kin will be mailed the interment flag that was actually used during the military funeral service and advised of the name and the location of the cemetery, together with the plot, row and grave number in which final interment was made.

If the form, "Request for Disposition of Remains," or a reply to this letter is not received from you within fifteen days, the War Department will proceed on the assumption that you do not wish the remains returned to the United States for permanent burial.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delay.

Mrs. Robert M. Harvey of 213 South 5th Street, Reading, Penn., has forwarded your letter of January 8, 1944, in which you state that the Army Effects Bureau has received from overseas some personal property of her son First Lieutenant Robert M. Leveridge and that you desire certain information, which follows:-

Her son was not married. His father was killed in World War I, just as was this boy in our present War. The boy was adopted when he was about one year old by his aunt Miss Belle Da Costa Greene (secretary to the late Mr. J.P. Morgan and Director of the Pierpont Morgan Library) sister of Mrs. Harvey. The boy lived with his aunt who supported and educated him until he left for overseas. She was appointed his guardian by our New York County Surrogate and continued as such until he reached the age of 21 years when an order was entered discharging her as such guardian. He executed a power of attorney, coupled with an interest, which continues effective after his death under the laws of this State. He also left a last will which has not been probated because the estate is of nominal value.

I call your attention to the Fourth paragraph of the will and also to the appointment of his aunt as executrix.

I enclose copies of the originals which are in my possession and I certify to their correctness.

I knew the boy since his infancy and I know the facts in this letter to be correct.

In the event the effects will be sent to Miss Greene she will take care of them and arrange with the boy's Mother as to their distribution.
