Dear Mr. and Mrs. Freschauf:

Almost four years have elapsed since the cessation of hostilities of World War II which cost the life of your son, the late First Lieutenant Charles W. Freschauf, and it is with reluctance that I am writing for I must furnish information which may bring you added sorrow.

The records of the Department of the Army reveal that your son was one of the ten crew members manifested aboard the B-17 Aircraft Number 41-24515 which failed to return from a bombing mission over Wilhelmshaven, Germany, on 21 May 1943. Although nothing is known of the circumstances surrounding the loss of this aircraft, it is believed that it crashed into the North Sea and that all of the crew members perished as a result of the casualty.

Since that time, a complete search of the area has been made; however, there is no evidence that the remains of your son were ever washed ashore and buried in an isolated location. Furthermore, every effort has been made to correlate the records of unknown deceased interred in cemeteries in the general area of the disaster with the records of your son, but all attempts to do so have resulted in failure. Therefore, in view of the fact that no records can be located indicating that his remains have been recovered in the years that have elapsed since the time of the casualty, the Department of the Army has been forced to conclude that his remains are not recoverable. I wish to assure you that, should any additional information come to our attention indicating that his remains are in our possession, you will be informed immediately.

Realizing the extent of your grief and anxiety, it is not easy to express condolence to you who gave your loved one under circumstances so difficult that there is no grave at which to pay homage. May the knowledge of your son's honorable service to his country be a source of sustaining comfort to you.





SYNOPSIS OF CASE: The above comprised the entire crew of B-17 aircraft #41-24615 which on 21 May 1943 failed to return from a bombing mission over Wilhelmshaven, Germany. Aircraft is believed to have been lost in the North Sea, near the target. Army Air Force records indicate that four aircraft were lost on 21 May 1943 belonging to 91st Bomb Group. Returning crews reported one seen at 1243 hours at 23,000 feet east of Alte Mellum Island with #1 and #2 engines on fire and rapidly losing altitude, heading east under fighter attack. No parachutes were seen. Another aircraft was observed at 1244 hours near target at 23,000 feet with #2 engine on fire. No parachutes seen. Dulag (AV 136/43) and microfilm 11240 reports that the body of S/Sgt Simpson was washed ashore at Wilhelmshaven on 21 May 1943 and buried 27 May 1943 in Wilhelmshaven Cemetery, field D, grave #166. Alphabetical Dulag mentions "Joslin J. W. Lt - 6296". - Investigation conducted at Wilhelmshaven in 1947 proved negative. Reinvestigation conducted in 1948 did not reveal any further information. Remains buried in grave #166 proved to be British. It is believed that all clues have been exhausted on this case and that further investigation would be futile.

2. All attached supporting documents are copied from records in file headquarters American Graves Registration Command.

3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S. Military Cem eteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.

4. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.

OPERATIVE REPORT

On 6.8.1947 I was dispatched by this Headquarters to Wilhelmshaven, Germany (K 54/122) to investigate the crash of a C-47 aircraft on 11.7.1943. Lt. Ball, William B. and 1/2pt. Cole, Robert are missing since 11.7.1943. Operational instructions # 41 stated that the remains of S/Bat Willard C. Simpson, a member of the same crew were washed ashore in Wilhelmshaven and buried at the Military Garrison Cemetery in Field "EP" grave 166 (no date was given).

Instructions of HQ in this case read: "In an effort will be made to associate remains of unknowns recovered from this area with the casualties listed on enclosed HQ Form 100."

1. I was unable to check with records in our office, as there are no lists available of bodies previously removed from Wilhelmshaven.

2. I proceeded to Wilhelmshaven and contacted the Town Council. There I obtained a list (see incl. # 1) of all casualties buried in the Military Cemetery of Wilhelmshaven. The list does not show the name of 1st Lt. Ball or 1/2pt. Cole.

No information is available at the cemetery of Wilhelmshaven as to where bodies buried at Wilhelmshaven were removed. A note on the cemetery list (see incl. # 1) states that all bodies were removed in June 1947 to Althorn, but this information is wrong, since I have checked with British Headquarters in Ldenburg and it proved (see incl. 2 Schum. Rep.) that only one US unknown was buried in Wilhelmshaven on 21.8.1943, three months prior to plane crash reported in HQ case # 1534.

3. In compliance with instructions contained in basic document that a check be made in the area I proceeded to Jevera and checked with the cemetery records. They show (see incl. 3) that no US deceased was buried in the area on 11.7.1943. I checked the names on the list (see incl. 3) and they do not correspond with the ones reported in enclosed HQ Form. The same list (see incl. 3) reports one unknown body washed ashore on 13.7.1944 and buried at the cemetery of Jevera (K-64/177), but no records are available at this Headquarters of bodies removed from that area.

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4. I was unable to check on the plane crash, since location records were destroyed. (See incl. # 4).

5. It is not possible for me to check with the records of 1st Lt. Ball or 1/2pt. Cole to establish if they were removed from that area with subject deceased, as no records are available at this Headquarters pertaining to deceased removed from Wilhelmshaven and area. Plane crashes in Wilhelmshaven cannot be checked as records were destroyed.

RECORDS SECTION:

1. Forwarded herewith records of the reinvestigation conducted at WILHELMSHAVEN (X-54/7-14) and OLDENBURG (X-54/7-30), Germany in connection with APO Case 534 (S/1. Willard C. Simpson).

2. According to all information obtained during the investigation, the remains of S/Sgt. Simpson were buried in Grave D-166 of WILHELMSHAVEN, Germany. The remains recovered from Grave D-166 by the British CR Unit and now reburied in the British Military Cemetery at OLDENBURG, Germany cannot be associated with S/Sgt. Simpson (See attached narratives).

b) that this deceased was evacuated on 7 July 1947 by the British and is now buried in British Military Cemetery, SAGE, Germany, plot IV, row A, grave 10.

c) that this deceased listed as Unknown, RAF, is reported by the British to be wearing RAF Battle dress trousers and that the only means of establishing this fact with certitude is to disinter the said remains, to which the British (74 SCU) agree.

d) that no trace could be found of the other nine (9) missing crew members, indicating that they probably crashed in the sea and are unrecoverable.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended by this investigator that a disinterring team be dispatched from this Headquarters to CLEVER, Germany reporting to 74 Graves Concentration Unit for the purpose of assisting at the joint disinterment of the deceased in SAGE Cemetery, plot IV, row A, grave 10 and evacuating the said remains if they prove to be American. Special care should be given to the items of clothing (especially the trousers) in order to establish if the trousers are in fact RAF Battle dress, as claimed, or some type of discolored GI trousers, as presumed by the undersigned investigator.



1. The following named Air Corps personnel were reported missing in action, in flying pay status, over Wilhelmshaven, Germany, since 21 May 1943, (the officers by Casualty Branch Message No. 146109, the enlisted men by Casualty Branch Message No. 146102), and were presumed dead as of 22 May 1944, under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act:

2. Missing Air Crew Report No. 3458, dated 6 April 1944, names the subject persons of the 324th Bombardment Squadron, 91st Bombardment Group, as members of the crew of B-17F aircraft No. 41-24515, which participated in a bombardment mission to Wilhelmshaven, Germany, on 21 May 1943. No information was available as to the cause of its loss.

a. A note on the reverse side of the Report reads as follows:

"This Group; lost 4 aircraft this date. None were identified. Two were seen to leave the formation, one east of Alte Mellen (sic), one just after target. It headed back into Germany."

b. A map attached to the Report designated two points, at one of which the aircraft was last seen. One of these was just north of Schiermonnikoog Island, of the East Frisian Group, the other a few miles southwest of Wilhelmshaven.

c. In addition to the personnel named in paragraph 1, above, Staff Sergeant Willard O. Simpson, 37117173, was named as a crew member.

3. Prisoner of War Report JS/1915, received 17 August 1943, reported the death of Sergeant Simpson, adding that he was shot down 21 May 1943, near Wilhelmshaven. JS/1960, received 2 September 1943, stated that his body washed ashore on 21 May 1943, near Wilhelmshaven. Captured German Records AW 136/43 furnishes information that Sergeant Simpson's body was found in the 4th harbor entrance of Wilhelmshaven. Sheet No. 111240, Volume 2, Film 14, of captured German records, gives substantially the same information, and adds that the type of aircraft was unknown.

4. Records of the 91st Bombardment Group for May 1943, on file in the Office of the Secretary of Air Staff, Sources and Reference Group, show that the Group lost four aircraft in the attack on Wilhelmshaven 21 May 1943; three from the 324th Bombardment Squadron, one from the 323rd. The listing of each crew is given in the records. All of the members of three of the crews have been accounted for; the fourth is the subject crew. Two or more members of each of the three crews were captured, and captured German Records show that their planes went down over land west of Wilhelmshaven, and within twenty miles of that city.

5. The officers and enlisted men named in paragraph 1, above, were members of the crew of a B-17 aircraft which was lost while on a bombing mission to Wilhelmshaven, Germany, 21 May 1943. There was no definite information as to the location of the plane when it left the formation, but from the fact that the body of one crew member was recovered from the entrance to Wilhelmshaven harbor, while no trace has been found of any of the others, it is reasonable to conclude that the plane went down over water, and that none of the crew survived.

6. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death, and that a casualty report be initiated stating that the officers and enlisted men named in paragraph 1, members of the Air Corps, were killed in action 21 May 1943, near Wilhelmshaven, Germany, while in flying pay status.

The systemat will be processed in accordance with Paragraph 2b, Operations Bulletin 35, 1945. The casualty report and official report of death will include the following statement:

Finding of Death has been issued previously under Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, showing presumed date of death as 22 May 1944. This "Report of Death" based on information received since that date, is issued in accordance with Section 9 of said Act and its effect on prior payments and settlements is as provided in Section 9.
