I have to submit for your information the following report:-

At Celle, on 28th. March, 1947 at 11.45 hours on information received from Sgt. Powell, N.C.O. i/c Traffic Section, I proceeded to Mr. 2 Lumber Group, Black Watch Regt. Woodpecker Site, in company with Cpl. Collins, P., R.A.F. Police.

I contacted Major Buchanan, Black Watch, who showed me the remains of an American airman lying in the forest. A parachute lay opened at the spot, but Major Buchanan informed me that it was packed earlier, but had been interfered with, presumably by soldiers of this Lumber Group.

Branches of the tree directly above had been broken off, but had grown again. By the hole in the ground, it was obvious that this airman had dropped from a considerable height and his parachute had not opened.

Major Dyson, O/C. Woodpeckers gave me the attached Identity Card and Identity Tag which had the following particulars written on

NARRATIVE REPORT

Being dispatched to Ovelgoenne, Germany, (L-54/R-42) to investigate the case of 2nd Lt., GERALD E. ROGERS, O-806152, whose remains were supposed to have been found unburied in the forest near Ovelgoenne, according to letter from First Field Command, American Graves Registration Command, dated 11 April 1947, I arrived at Ovelgoenne on 5 May 1947.

I questioned the forester in Ovelgoenne who told me that the body had been found in the Fuhrberg District, about 12 kilometers from Ovelgoenne. In Fuhrberg I went to the District Forester Erich Meyer who stated, (see Incl. # 1) that in the forest District # 64 the body of an American Airman had been found unburied. The remains were first discovered by English troops, who are working in that particular forest, while cutting timber. He also states that he had heard rumors to the effect that the body had been in possession of one gold wrist watch, three gold rings, and a billfold. The English troops from Celle evacuated the body, and only afterwards he was shown the place by an English soldier. He claims that one could see very clearly that several branches of trees had been broken when the body fell to the ground. He further stated that in fall 1944 he was ordered to make a search in the woods for equipment of airmen, such as flare pistols, first aid kits, and other things. At that time he found several parts of equipment which were taken to the Celle airbase by a German corporal. This was about 200 meter from the spot where the body was found. I then interrogated Friedrich Luessennop, who was employed by the forester at that time, and who also gave a statement. (See Incl. # 2). He states that he was told by the English who were working in the woods that a body of an airman had been found and that also 2 rings, a wrist watch, a change purse or billfold, as well as identification tags had been located on the body. The parachute also was found in good condition. On the same day in the afternoon he was accompanied when he went to see the body. He, at that time, did not see the above mentioned personal effects or the parachute anymore. On the same or the next day the English police arrived and took charge of everything.

Because I could not gather any more information in this town, I had the forester Meyer show me the place where the body had been. The body had been removed to the 54th British General Hospital in Celle and had been picked up there by a disinterment team of this Headquarters. I found the spot where the body had been. It could be seen that the body had broken off branches of trees while falling, and also the ground was a little disturbed from where the body was removed. While investigating the place where the body had been found I met Walter Nienierza of the 348 Transportation Service Group, who states, (See Incl. # 3), that he went to the place three days after the body had been found where he saw the parachute but saw none of the rings, watch, billfold, German and American Money, which he was told had been found on the body.

TRANSLATION

SECURITY STATEMENT

My name is Erich Meyer, District forester, Fuhrberg. I state the following:

- 1) In April 1947 I got to know that in district 64 Forst Community of Lindhorst Forester's Office Fuhrberg, the body of an American airman had been found. The body was discovered by English who are working in this forest. I was told that the body was in possession of a gold wristwatch, 3 gold rings, and a billfold.
- 2) The English from Celle evacuated the body. I never saw the spot where the body had been till it was shown to us by an Englishman. It can be seen very clearly that the body broke several branches of the trees during the fall.
- 3) In fall 1944 I was ordered by the airbase in Celle to search the woods around the 64th district, because several persons had found equipment parts of a air crew. At that time flare pistols, first aid kits, and other equipment was found and taken to the Celle airbase by a corporal. The body was found approximately 200 meters off this place.
- 4) There never occurred a crash of any plane near the place where the body has been found.

6 May 1947

My name is Friedrich Luessenhop, wood cutter, Fuhrberg. Concerning the body of an American airman, which was found here in the woods, I make the following statement:

- 1) One morning in the middle of the month of April 1947 I was told by some English that the body of an airman had been found in the forest. I also was told that one wristwatch, 2 rings & change purse or ballfold with money as well as identification tags were found. I further was told that the parachute was found in good condition on the body.
- 2) On the same day in the afternoon I went in the company of an English sergeant, I do not know his name, to the place and had a look at the body. I did not see the parachute nor any of the above mentioned personal effects. As far as I can tell there have not been any Germans on the place where the body was found between the time of finding and the time I was at the place.
- 3) On the same day or the day after the police of the English airfield arrived. I saw that the police went to the place where the body was.
- 4) I further state the whole matter has been taken charge of by the English.
- 5) As far as I can remember, I have been the only person employed by the forester's office who had the opportunity to see the body.

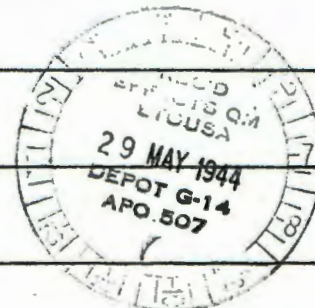
