Scott, 0660687, was reported "missing in action" on the 26th December 1941 per Battle Casualty Report and teletype message as required by pertinent regulations. However, these reports were followed by a supplementary report on 11th January 1944, changing the status of this officer to "killed in action" as a result of continuous investigation which, under the provisions of Par. 5, WD Circular 195, 1st september 1943, the circumstances of his disappearance led to no other logical conclusion than death. 2. Capt. Scott was flying a Photo Reconnaissance Mission to Osnabruck and Munster, Germany in a Spitfire 11, No. PA 851, on the 23rd December 1943. Information available indicates that pilot was over the North Jea when loss of an engine occurred. Attempting to return to England, a distress call was placed and received at 1020 hours by coastal flight control stations. At the time, pilot stated that his motor was out and that he was gliding at 15,000 feet altitude. Radio contact was continuous through the next eight minutes in which numerous vectors to the nearest point of land were given the pilot. Radio contact was lost at 1028 hours when pilot reported his altitude as 5,000 feet. Walrus aircraft of the air-sea rescue service were informed and immediately dispatched to the last point of cross vectors. Personnel on board the walrus aircraft reported a concentrated oil slick on the water at the probable point of crash. 3. In the compilation of information received via radio contact, DF vectors, and reports of the air-sea rescue service, no other logical conclusion could be drawn other than that pilot had crashed into the North Sea approximately 10 miles off the coast of Southwold, England. 4.
