

Dear Mrs. Blaida:

I am writing to you in reference to your son who gave his life in the service of his Country during the European conflict.

In an effort to furnish the next of kin with all available details concerning casualties among our personnel, the Army Air Forces recently completed the translation of several volumes of captured German records.

In regard to Staff Sergeant John M. Blaida, these records indicate that he was killed on 29 May 1944, when his B-24 (Liberstor) bomber was shot down by enemy aircraft and crashed at Gueltz (53° 45° North Latitude, 13° 11° East Longitude), Germany, twelve and one-half miles southeast of Demmin. These records further state that on 31 May 1944, his body was recovered and interred in grave eight, which is located one-half mile away from the Gueltz farm.

The Quartermaster General in his capacity as Chief, American Graves Registration Service, is charged with the responsibility of notifying the legal next of kin concerning grave locations of members of the military forces who are killed or die outside the continental limits of the United States. If the report of your son's burial has not been confirmed and you have not been notified by the Quartermaster General, that official will furnish you definite information immediately upon receipt of the official report of interment from the Commanding General of the Theater concerned.

May the knowledge of your son's valuable contribution to our cause sustain you in your bereavement.

- 1. HERMANN ROSCHE, HERMANN HAHN, JOHANNES WEGNER, all farmers living in Eldena, Germany (Coord. RT 4522, M-54) and REINHOLD VOLCK, living in Altona ajoining Eldena, all were witnesses of the following case and give substantially the same information which is as follows: During the middle of April 1944 a 4-motored US bomber was shot down over the south eastern edge of Eldena, 150 meters from the old Elde bridge. One (1) dead body was found in the plane and two (2) wounded men, six (6) men parachuted to safety. All nine (9) crew members, living, wounded and dead, and the plane wreckage were removed to the Airport at Ludwigslust. It was presumed that the living were sent to a PoW camp.
- 2. The cemetery records of HANS MUND, cemetery caretaker at Ludwigslust show that on April 15 1944 one (1) unidentified American flier's body was brought in for burial by the Luftwaffe from the airport. He was buried there in the city cemtery. His records also show that on 24 January 1944 eight (8) unknown American fliers were brought in from a Fortress crash at Fresenbrugge (Coord.: RT 5426, M-54). These eight (8) were buried in a common grave in the same cemetery in Ludwigslust. (This was before the Eldena crash as the date shows.)
- 3. HANS MUND'S records and also those of the police show that sometime in June 1944 under the supervision of a German Graves Registration Ober-Lt., all nine (9) American bodies and those of two (2) English fliers were disinterred from the city protestant cemetery, and reburied in the woods in an old ammunition dump at the edge of Ludwigslust. All nine (9) Americans were buried in one (1) grave and the two (2) Englishmen in another common grave beside them.
- 4. The Burgermeister and the Police both testify that either at the end of June or early in July 1945 the American Authorities and the English Authorities both came and disinterred and removed their respective deceased. No one knows the American unit who did the disinterring or where the Bodies were removed to. The graves are now empty.
- 5. From the information on the German Luftwaffe burial card (AGRC case No. 3387) T/Sgt. Thahad Hunter, AAF Fortress Crew Member, died in a crash at Eldena 11 April 1944 and was buried in the cemetery in Ludwigslust 15 April 1944 This agrees with the above information.

The Field established identification of remains of John M. Blaida, 16176158. This office has reviewed the case and recommends approval thereof, based on the following points of identification:

- 1. Unknown X-6291 disinterred from Gultz, Mecklenburg, Germany, Grave #8 (Exhibit A). This is in agreement with burial location recorded in German Record AV 965/44 (Exhibit B) for Blaida, S/Sgt, 16176158.
- 2. German records list the name Miller, Corbett X, 33143468, (as written in his Soldiers Individual Pay Record). Miller is not a casualty nor was he a member of Blaida's crew. The Germans recorded Miller's name from his pay book, therefore it may be assumed that one of the crew had this pay book in his possession.
- 3. Recording of name and serial, tetanus shots and blood type on AV 965/44 is evidence identification tags were present at time of death.
- 4. US Army clothing found with Unknown X-6291.
- 5. Wooden cross over the grave of X-6291 had an ID tag nailed on it as follows: "John M. Blaida, 16176158 T43-3 B C".
- 6. MACR #5212 (Exhibit C) for Blaida lists only one (1) crew member as EUS. Ten (10) crew members were aboard. Nine (9) members were killed and one (1) has been identified as: George E. MacDonald, Jr., 11017433, Plot AA, Row 11, Grave 260, Neuville, also disinterred from Gultz, grave #3, agreeing with German Record AV 965/44. Eight (8) crew members are left to be accounted for and are all in the process of identification. (Approved by Field)
- 7. The only Americans disinterred from Gultz, Germany, are the nine crew members listed on MACR #5212 (Exhibit C).
- 8. Dental chart for Unknown X-6291 compares favorably with Army dental records of Blaida (Exhibit D).
- 9. Tooth chart for X-6291 has been checked with tooth charts for all other deceased crew members on MACR #5212 with negative results.
- 10. Estimated height, 6'2 3/8" for X-6291, in agreement with height, 6'1" recorded in Army records for Blaida (Exhibit D).

- 11. Narrative and Map Sketch (Exhibit E) are in agreement with burial location for Blaida as recorded in German Records (Exhibit B).
- 12. Date and place of death for X-6291 agrees with MACR #5212, German Records, Statement of Witness (Exhibit F) and AGO Report of Death (Exhibit G) for Blaida.




