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STANDARD CONDITIONS:

The presentation of this authorization to the representative of the Department of the Army at the cemetery will be his authority for erection of this monument. When the representative of the Army arrives at the cemetery, no work is to be started until after the representative of the Department of the Army has been contacted. Failure with this requirement may necessitate the removal of the work prior to receiving appropriate authority to proceed with the

Approval for the erection of this monument is being given understanding that the person purchasing same will make provision for future maintenance in the event that repairs are necessary. In that the monument becomes in need of repairs or unserviceable, reserves the right to replace it with a Government headstone.

If desired, the family name in large letters may be inscribed on the rear face of the die.

Any insignia, emblems, floral carvings or other approved designs are to be shape formed, not merely outline cut; and are to be set in a sunken panel, or otherwise carved in order that the face thereof not extend beyond the surface of the monument.

The lot or grave number will be inscribed on the rear face in the lower right hand corner. The numerals to be approximately one inch high.

The material, as stated, is approved provided it is select stock of fine uniform grain, entirely free of seams, spots, knots, stains and discolorations, and all other formations and textures which would give an undesirable irregularity or mar its appearance and impair its durability. This material must not only be such as to give good appearance when the monument is first erected, but must be strong enough to withstand the weather and not turn dark after a certain time. This Office will approve for erection in national cemeteries light colored material, only, as dark materials and materials which have darkened after weathering are not in keeping with the character of the cemeteries.

All work on this monument must be done in the very best manner and be satisfactory to the representative of the Department of the Army at the cemetery; otherwise, when the finished monument is delivered to him for erection will not be permitted.

The representative of the Department of the Army at the national cemetery should be informed immediately upon completion of the placement of the monument at the designated location, in order that it may be inspected and advised of its acceptance.



This is true even though she may be acting as "guardian" of the decedent's minor son. It is noted that both Mrs. Fergusson and Lt Gen Almond have previously expressly recognized the decedent's father as the appropriate person to direct disposition of the remains of Major Galloway. To permit Mrs. Fergusson to erect a private marker without Mr. Galloway's agreement would not only be contrary to previously established policy but could place the Department in an untenable position should Mr. Galloway decide to erect a monument as next of kin.

1. Reference is made to the attached 293 File of Thomas T. Galloway, whose remains are interred in Grave 4938-A, Section 2, Arlington National Cemetery.

2. Mrs. Margaret Almond Fergusson, who is the widow of Major Thomas T. Galloway, has made arrangements with Arlington and Clagett Memorial Company to erect a private monument at the grave of her former husband. However, since she remarried subsequent to the death of Maj. Galloway and since Mrs. Fergusson invested in Mr. Joseph B. Galloway of Towson, Maryland, the father of her first husband, full authority for the disposition of the remains of her first husband, this Office by letter dated 24 February 1959 advised Arlington and Clagett that since the records of the Office of The Quartermaster General indicate that Mr. Galloway is the NOK it will be necessary to submit a statement signed by him to the effect that he has no objection to the erection of the proposed monument.

3. Mrs. Fergusson has discussed this matter with the Cemetery Branch by telephone on two occasions. It seems that she is averse to consulting with the father of her first husband, due to the fact that she and the father had agreed that they would jointly put a memorial window in some Church in Baltimore, but the father failed to consult with her or allow her to participate in the cost of the memorial window.

4. In a discussion between Mrs. Fergusson and Mr. Myers, of the Cem. Br., on 2 March 1959, she stated that although it may appear to be childish, she still has a strong aversion to asking permission of her first husband's father to erect the monument. In the discussion it was brought out that she is the legal guardian of Thomas Galloway Fergusson, the son of her first husband, who has now been adopted by her present husband. She advises that the Veterans Administration has so designated her for the purpose of benefits, which the son receives from that agency. The question is therefore raised as to whether or not the son of the first husband is ~~the~~ the legal NOK of Maj. Thomas T. Galloway, ~~through his~~ as guardian; also whether or not she as guardian, acting for him, can legally erect the monument to his father and her former husband, ~~without~~ ^{the consent of deceased father.}



Dear General Almond:

I am pleased to have an opportunity to reply to your inquiry of 24 January 1957 about the erection of private monuments at the graves of your son, Captain Edward H. Almond, Jr., and your son-in-law, Major Thomas T. Galloway.

While the Army has been forced, for reasons which you will understand, to discontinue the furnishing of names of monument suppliers in this area in response to general inquiries, I have taken the liberty on my own responsibility of listing a few of the firms which have done satisfactory work in Arlington.

Admiral Vickery's monument was erected in the fall of 1947. His widow made all of the arrangements with a local firm, which has now become the Arlington-Clagett Memorial Company, 502 New Hampshire Avenue, S. W. One of the employees in the office said, in response to an inquiry about the monument, that it had cost about \$600 when it was ordered and might now cost as much as \$700. She emphasized that these are only rough figures, since so many imponderables, such as changing freight rates and labor costs, enter into each sale. She also said that a granite monument might be available for about the same current price as the one she estimated on a marble monument.

In the inclosed leaflet there is considerable information on the general subject of erection of private monuments in national cemeteries. The firms I have named and most of the others in this area which are listed in the Classified Telephone Directory are familiar with the routine requirement that they furnish to our office statements of authorization from purchasers and blueprints of the monuments before any work is undertaken in Arlington.




S T A T E M E N T

The undersigned and Captain Thomas T. Galloway collided in mid-air SE of Crulai, France while on a fighter sweep through NW France on 24 July 1944. Both aircraft went out of control, spiralling earthward from 15,000 feet. I bailed out making a delayed jump. When I pulled the rip-cord, I saw the two aircraft crash below. I saw no other parachute.

On landing, I was soon taken to the home of a Frenchman who lived at the "House of the Forest" on the South edge of the Foret du Perche, North of the town of TOUROUVRE, France. This individual was apparently affiliated with the Marquis organization, as he had occasional visitors. After inquiring for my comrade several times, a Frenchman came bearing a note containing the name and serial number of Capt Galloway. The name was correctly spelled, and I did not recognize the serial number. The bearer of this note said that Captain Galloway was dead, and had been buried by the French. I am under the impression that he was buried in a French Cemetery, and that the grave may be marked, as the Germans are apparently very indifferent to fresh graves, making few inquiries regarding them. The Frenchman made mention of flowers being included in the interment service. When I inquired whether Captain Galloway had been burnt, the answer was in the negative.

It should be stated that I speak no French, and none of my helpers spoke English, so conversation was carried out by means of signs and a French-American dictionary.

The attached map overlay gives the location of all known places.





My dear Senator Radcliffe:

I have your letter of 8 December 1944, requesting information in behalf of the father of the late Major Thomas T. Galloway.

I understand how very much it means to Mr. Galloway to be furnished information concerning the death of his brave son. The official records show that Major Galloway was a pilot and sole occupant of a P-38 type aircraft which departed from England on 24 July 1944, on an area patrol mission to Argentan, France. While flying at an altitude of fifteen thousand feet on the afternoon of that day, his aircraft collided in mid-air with that of another of his group, about forty miles southwest of Evreux, France. Both planes went into a flat spin and the pilot of one successfully left his aircraft by parachute; however, no parachute was seen leaving Major Galloway's plane. In an interview with the pilot of this plane he stated that in response to his many inquiries regarding the fate of Major Galloway, the information was furnished that Major Galloway was dead and that his remains had been buried by the French. He was also given a piece of paper on which the name of Major Galloway and serial number were given. Due to the difficulty of communication it was not possible to ascertain the location of the grave nor whether it was marked. After careful consideration and study of all the facts and circumstances submitted pertaining to Major Galloway's status, including the foregoing, it was officially established that he was killed in action on 24 July 1944, the date he had previously been reported missing in action. You may be certain that in the event more particulars are received, his family will be notified immediately.

The wish of Mr. Galloway to be advised as to the specific place of burial of the remains of his son is most understandable and it is regretted that no information is available in this office






