MISSION SUMMARY REPORT

MISSION # 218

Date 28 February 1945

ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: SOEST, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "B" Group. Two GH A/C were furnished by the 403rd Group -- one each for the lead and high squadrons. One PFF was included in the lead and high squadrons. Three spares accompanied the formation.

3. Flight Over England:
 - a. Takeoff:

Takeoff was as briefed with good visibility -- all ships took off successfully.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

The squadron and group assemblies were as briefed with the lead squadron at 9,000'. Assembly was accomplished in very good time. With 36 aircraft and 3 spares our formation before departure time.

c. Route Over England:

Wing assembly was accomplished as briefed and route over England was followed. With C. P. # 1 made on course 1 minute late. The 94th "B" group left C. P. # 1 in briefed # 2 division position.

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

Was as briefed and the group maintained its position in the Division column. The timings were nearly as briefed with only a minute or two either way.

b. Bombing Run:

Cloud cover over the IP and target was 10/10's. The bomb run was made in group formation on a strictly GH run. Bombs were salvoed by the group lead on the GH operators synchronization. All others used a 30 foot intervalometer setting. Results were unobserved. The high squadron made an individual GH run, bombing somewhat to the left of the lead and low squadrons about 4 minutes early.

c. Flight from Target:

The rally was accomplished in good time although two groups moved in ahead of us before reaching C. P. # 4. After crossing enemy lines a let down was started and continued to 10,000 feet. Then after crossing the continental coast a let down to 7,000 feet was made.

d. Return to Base:

As there was a 10/10's undercast it was necessary to make an instrument let down over the buncher. After let down the aircraft returned to base and landed individually.

e. Weather:

Weather was 10/10's strato-cumulus with base at 5,000 and tops 6,000 - 7,000 over nearly the entire route with occasional small breaks over the continent. And large breaks south of the route over Germany. No middle cloud and 2 - 3/10's high cloud at about 28,000. No contrails encountered at flight altitude enroute.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

4. f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was adequate.

g. Comments on Formation:

Formation was good throughout entire mission. High and Low squadron leaders should be commended on an excellent job.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

Where all Groups have their own GH aircraft and operators this type of mission will be quite a bit more successful.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

A/C 43-38862 - No Credit. No 3 engine oil pressure dropped to 40 lbs-- cylinder head temp went up to 225°. No. 3 engine instruments corrected to show apparent engine failure.

6. Enemy Opposition:

No air opposition nor flak was encountered.

7. Battle Damage: None.

8. Casualties: None.

9. Statistical Summary of Operations: (See attached form)

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Due to complete undercast results were unobserved.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

Of the 13 A/C sorties, 12 attacked the primary target, dropping 214 X 250# GP and 24 X 500# IB. Aborting A/C 862 returned 18 GP's and 2 IB's to base.

Low Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C of the low squadron bombed the primary target, dropping 214 X 250# GP and 24 X 500# IB bombs. The spare returned 18 GP's and 2 IB's to base.

High Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the primary target, dropping 215 X 250# GP and 24 X 500# IB. The spare returned 18 X 250# GP and 2 X 500# IB's to base.

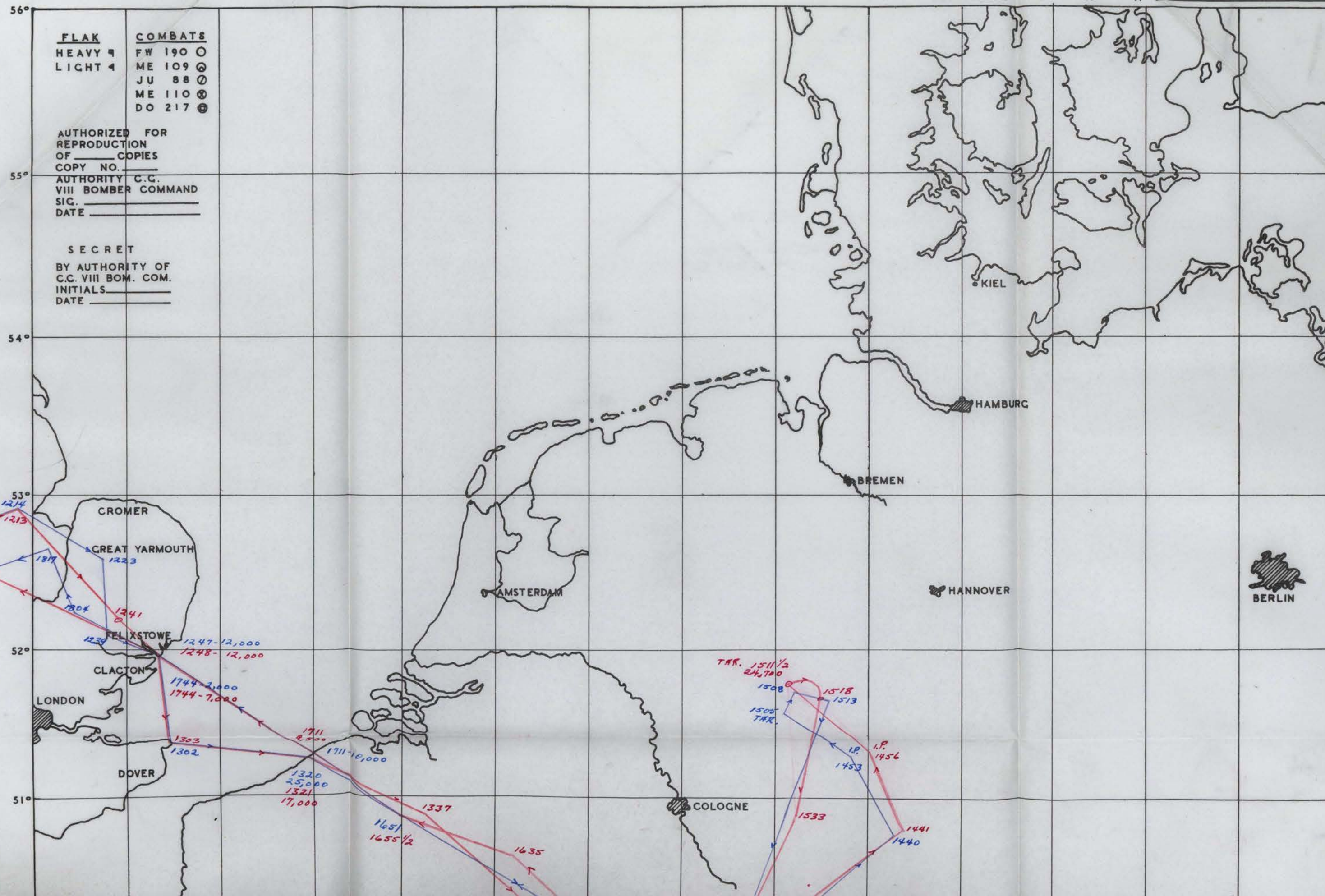

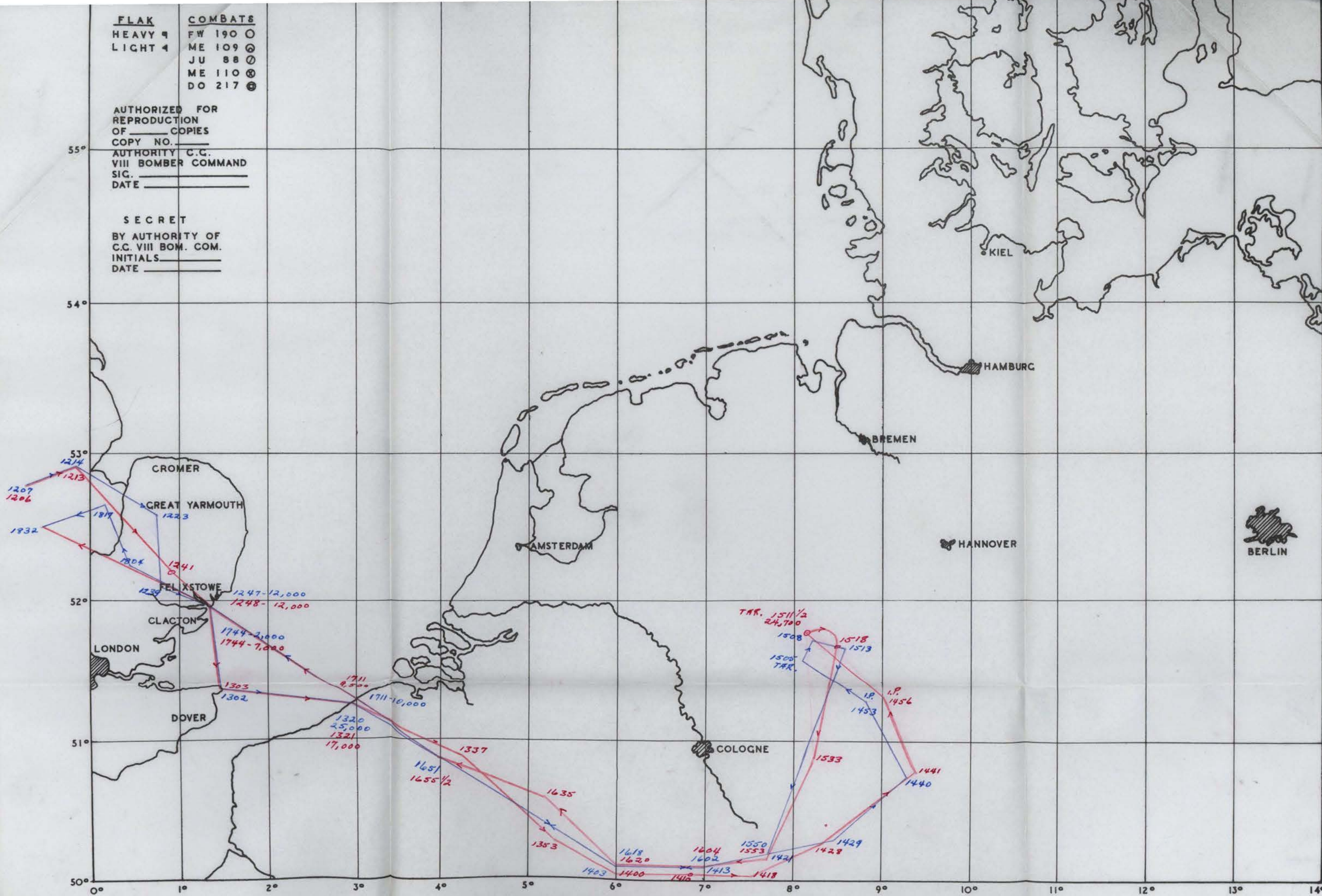
