MISSION SUMMARY REPORT

MISSION # 203

Date 3 February 1945

ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: BERLIN, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "B" Group. Two PFF A/C were included in the lead box and one in each of the other two squadrons. A spare accompanied each squadron.

3. Flight Over England:

a. Takeoff:

Takeoff was normal with excellent weather conditions. It was made in darkness and all ships took off successfully.

3. b. Squadren and Group Assemblies:

Squadren and Group assemblies over Cottesmore Bunker were accomplished in fairly good time. But delayed somewhat by darkness and the fact that it was the first night assembly for sometime and the newer crews were a bit inexperienced. The group was assembled except for two aircraft by departure time.

c. Reute Over England:

Departure from bunker was made on time and the briefed route was flown over England. Central point # 1 was made on time but 5 miles south of course due to the fact that the Group's ~~xxxxxx~~ jammed up on the Division assembly line. But the correct position was attained (# 8 in the column) a few miles en route out across the channel.

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

Central point # 2 was reached on course but 6 minutes late due to the fact the whole division was that much late. Central point # 3 was made on course 7 minutes late. Just prior to the IP Buckeye Blue reported that bombing could be done visually. The IP was made good and squadrons uncovered for individual runs.

b. Bombing Run:

The IP was made good. The route, up until the IP, was solidly undercast, but from the IP in it was CAVU. The bombardier picked up Templehof Airdrome to the right of course, then located the marshalling yards in front of the target, and finally located the target area itself. The assigned MPI was covered with smoke from previous bombing and so was never seen. By using the RAF grid, the bombardier was able to synchronize on a point short of the target and then roll the indice back, to point it at the assigned MPI. He then double checked the rate by using the target picture and locating points on a line with the assigned MPI, and outside of the smoked area. The AFCE worked O. K. Bombs were salvoed by the lead and dropped with a 150 ft. intervalometer setting by all others. Strikes were seen in the smoke of the previous group's bombs, which covered the target. The Low and High Squadrons came in just as the Lead Squadron did and met with the same conditions and handled them in exactly the same manner, both using the RAF grid to bomb through the smoke. The two leads salvoed; the others used 150 ft. intervalometer settings. The High Squadron strikes were unobserved, while the low were seen to fall right in the smoke over the assigned MPI.

c. Flight from Target:

Rally was completed very quickly after bombing and briefed route was flown. Central point # 4 was reached on course, with the formation following the division column.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

4. d. Return to Base:

Let down was started after central point # 4 and continued until 3000 feet was reached at which height the English Coast was crossed. The route over England on return was normal, using the Northern Cross-in Point. A/C 44-6508 failed to return -- having notified leader over target he was heading for Russia. A/C 42-102468 found it necessary to land at Weedbridge on return. All others landed safely at home base.

e. Weather:

Weather was as briefed and with no restriction at flight altitude. It was described as clear becoming 2/10ths to 4/10ths at mid-channel, increasing to 4/10ths to 6/10ths at continental coast, tops 8,000 to 10,000 feet; became 8/10ths to 10/10ths at 0600 E, tops to 18,000 feet -- became 4/10ths at 1200 E, tops to 8,000 feet. Target itself was clear, visibility to 10 to 15 miles.

f. Fighter Support:

Was excellent and Buckeye Blue's recommendations both on target and let down weather were very accurate and considerably helpful.

g. Comments on Formation:

Both Squadron and Group formation was good to excellent and Division column was better than average.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

Loss Squadron: A/C 43-38788 - Net Sertie. Returned early when # 4 oil pressure reached 20 lbs. and oil temperature 100°. Investigation revealed # 4 oil pressure gauge was cut and # 4 shutter on oil cooler stuck.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)10. Bombing Data:a. Observations:

Bombfalls of the lead and low squadrons were right in the smoke of the preceding group's bombs on the assigned MPI. The bombfall was some 8000 feet short, however, it fell in a large marshalling yard and should have caused extensive damage.

b. Disposition of Bombs:Lead Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/c of the lead squadron attacked the primary target dropping 100 X 500# RDX and 20 X 500# GP bombs. The spare returned 10 RDX to base.

Low Squadron:

Twelve A/C EET and attacked the primary target, dropping 80 X 500# RDX and 40 X 500# GP (incl 10 Long Delays). Aborting A/C 788 jettisoned 10 RDX in channel.

High Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C bombed the primary target, dropping 110 X 500# RDX and 10 X 500# GP bombs. The spare returned 10 RDX to base.



SUBJECT: Crew Comments and Suggestions. (mission to Berlin 3 February 1948)

TO : 1. COMMANDING OFFICER, AIR STA. 120, APO 807, U. S. ARMY.

1. Capt. Lasher, Group Air Commander, reported that both "A" group High Squadron flew 1,000 feet too high all day, which caused both "B" group difficulty because of prop-wash. This comment was seconded by Lt. Schlueter, Low Squadron Leader.

2. Lt. Schlueter also stated that the second flight of the Low Section of the Lead Squadron flew too low.

3. Capt. Robert L. Stolzer, Deputy Group Commander, stated that the Low Section of the Lead Squadron flew at all times in close trail of Lead sections; told him several times to move over to correct position.

4. Lt. Earl F. Carney, pilot A/C 6882, reports that there have been no flights in his crew chief's seat for a month, although he has complained several times. A/C dispersed in playroom #43.

5. Lt. Donald H. Schlueter, pilot A/C 7039, complimented his wingman, Lt. Smith, for flying the "best formation I've ever seen."

6. Lt. Norman Young, pilot of Deputy Group Lead A/C, reported that his Radio Operator was able to transmit radio message concerning the unidentified B-17 which ditched, almost immediately.

7. Lt. Arthur D. Wisco, Jr., pilot A/C 8791, reported a shortage of flask water.

8. Lt. Richard D. Richardson, pilot A/C 9018, thought the High Squadron flew too low all the time.

9. Lt. Donald H. Schlueter, pilot A/C 6815, thought the #2 and #3 A/C in the Lead Squadron flew a little too far back and out.

10. Lt. Herbert P. Cox, pilot A/C 8807, thought #2 A/C in Lead Squadron was low and a little far back.

11. The entire crew of Lt. Kenneth J. Hartsock, pilot A/C 8458, say this A/C is the cleanest and best kept A/C they have ever flown. They would like to compliment the crew chief and would be happy to complete their tour in this A/C.

12. Lt. Robert H. Jones, pilot A/C 7031, thought the High Squadron "eased" too much and that there was not enough interval between the Lead and High Squadron.

13. The crew of Lt. Robert H. Jones state that the quality of food served recently in the combat mess after a mission is poor, and that they do not get enough to eat.


