Date 21 January 1945

ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: ASCHAFFENBURG, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "C" Group. Two PFF A/C were included in the lead squadron with one included in the high squadron. A spare accompanied each formation.

3. Flight Over England:
 - a. Takeoff:

Takeoff was accomplished without incident despite darkness (0735) and snow on taxi strips and runways. Sky was cloudless up to the assembly altitude of 9000'.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Cont)

3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

Squadron assembled fairly quickly considering that it was dark up until 0815. However, at the briefed time to leave all the ships were not yet in formation. Therefore, the Cottesmore buncher was departed 2 minutes late with several ships drawing into position to form complete 36 A/C Group.

c. Route Over England:

The first part of the route over England was as briefed and wing formation was accomplished in proper order. Then the weather ship advised climbing 3000' above briefed altitude to avoid dense haze. Even this did not help and the other two groups of the wing were lost. Also the high squadron of this group was lost from view as the turn was made before the English coast.

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

Finally the group broke out of the haze over France and got the high squadron back in position. It turned out that the 94th "B" group was behind us, having flown completely out of the formation in the clouds over England. 94th "C" caught up to 94th "A" and continued on into the target. Then the "mickey" and Gee in the lead ship went out and the lead was turned over to the deputy. High clouds forced us to climb 2000' above briefed bombing altitude. Later the "mickey" and Gee went out in the deputy's ship. Accordingly the leader again took charge of his squadron and arranged for the leader of the high squadron, whose "mickey" was working, to go in first on the bomb run with the other two squadrons dropping on him. Just before the IP the 94th "B" group caught up and asked to go in ahead of 94th "C", which they did.

b. Bombing Run:

Ten minutes before the IP the air commander called the high squadron leader and told him to lead the group into the target and the other two squadrons would drop on his squadron. He took over and turned into the target about 2 miles east of the briefed IP. The cloud cover was 10/10ths all the way and the run was made PFF in group formation. The sighting angles checked out well with the Mickey man's data. Bombs were salvoed by the high squadron leader when the indices crossed. The lead and low squadrons leaders salvoed on the high's smoke marker. All others dropped with a 100' intervalometer setting. The AFCE worked satisfactorily. Results were unobserved.

c. Flight From Target:

After "bombs away" the leader again took over the Group lead and followed 94th "B" on the route out, with navigational help from the high squadron leader. No flak was encountered and no enemy fighter opposition seen. Due to weather the route back was somewhat south of course, but mainly as briefed.

4. d. Return to Base:

Return to base was as briefed except that weather was better than briefed - very clear all over England. All A/C landed safely at home base.

e. Weather:

Weather varied enroute from 8/10 to 10/10ths cumulus, tops 10,000' to 12,000' and occasionally 15,000' to 18,000'. Weather at target was 10/10ths cumulus, tops 20,000' to 22,000'. Dense semi-persistent contrails were encountered beginning at 18,000'.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was adequate.

g. Comments on Formation:

Low squadron very good, other squadrons fair with high squadron not keeping very close group formation. Formation on bombing run was good.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

All scheduled A/C attacked.

6. Enemy Opposition:

No enemy air opposition, nor was any flak encountered.

A 10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Due to complete undercast results were unobserved.

10. b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron: All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the secondary target, dropping 70 X 500# RDX and 70 X 500# IB bombs. A/C 680 encountering release troubles jettisoned 2 IB's at 4930-0920E. The spare returned 6 RDX's and 6 IB's to base.

Low Squadron: All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the secondary target, dropping 72 X 500# RDX and 70 X 500# IB bombs. A/C 425 encountering release troubles jettisoned 2 IB's at 4824-0818E. The spare returned 6 RDX's and 6 IB's to base.

High Squadron: All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the secondary target, dropping 71 X 500# RDX and 72 500# IB bombs. The spare returned 6 RDX's and 6 IB's to base.



SUBJECT: Crew Comments and Suggestions.

TO : COMMANDING OFFICER, AAF Sta. 128, APO 567, US Army.

1. Major Ralph J. White, Group Leader, suggests that 1st Air Division plan the withdrawal routes of Groups which are first over the target so they will not conflict with routes flown by Groups bombing later in the same target area.
2. Major White also reports that several A/C left Group formation upon return to England and landed early. Major White did not state which A/C these were.
3. Lt. Curran, pilot A/C 1072, believes that A/C 1072 is the best A/C on the field and one of the best maintained; this A/C is scheduled for 1000 hour check-up, and Lt. Curran's crew do not want to lose this A/C until they have finished their missions.
4. Lt. Long, pilot A/C 8637, reports that the BTG in A/C 132 (Donalson) left his turret right after bombs away, stating that the guns were pointed down the entire route back.
5. Several crew-members observed that the long runway should have been used on take-off this morning; pilots reported difficulty in becoming airborne soon enough.
6. Lt. Babcock, pilot A/C 585, thought the Group formation excellent at bombs away.
7. Lt. Carey, pilot A/C 862, dispersed in area #45, would like to have lights installed in crew chief's tent.
8. Lt. Schliemann, pilot A/C 8768, dispersed in area #16, waited over one hour for a truck to take his crew to interrogation.
9. Lt. Roadman, pilot A/C 2398, reported that air-speed was much too slow. He stated that he was indicating 125 mph. 15 minutes before IP was reached, and hit prop wash at that time, dropping 400 feet before he could recover control of his A/C. He suggests that, when the Group Leader becomes aware that he is over-running, he should ease instead of throttling down so much.
10. Lt. Thorne, pilot A/C 8607, reported that Major White's Deputy (Losinski) flew wide all day; Lt. Thorne believes this was not so much the fault of the Deputy Leader, but was the result of the fact that the Group Leader was flying very slow. Lt. Thorne reports that he was indicating about 150 mph..

11. Lt. Brown, Low Squadron Leader, reported that Lt. Cox, High Flight Leader of the Low Squadron, flew wide all day, actually flying in echelon off Lt. Brown's wing man.

12. Lt. Cracraft, pilot A/C 985, who was flying #3 position in the Low section of the Lead Squadron, reported that the High Flight Leader was so far out of position at bombs away that he (Lt. Cracraft) had to move practically on top of the #4 A/C of the Low Section in order to avoid being bombed.
