ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: EUDENBACH, GERMANY (Primary)
KOBLENZ, GERMANY (Secondary)
2. Commitments: The 401st group was to furnish the complete 36 A/C 94th "A" group including spares. A PFF A/C was to accompany each squadron and a GH A/C borrowed from 384th group was to fly in the lead squadron.

Also the 401st group furnished the Screening Force for the mission, flying a 12 A/C squadron.

3. Flight Over England:

a. Takeoff:

Takeoff was as briefed and right after takeoff weather ship recommended that assembly would have to be higher than briefed. Due to an aircraft running off the runway several ships were held up on takeoff--all but one finally took off though somewhat late.

b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

It was decided to assemble at briefed plus 3,000 but even at that height it was rather difficult due to haze and dense persistent contrails. By departure time the high squadron had assembled 12 ships the lead 11 ships and the low only 4 and it was decided to depart on time as there probably was some tie-up on the ground which prevented the other ships from taking off.

c. Route Over England:

The flight over England was as briefed except that a climb was made to 26,000 feet to avoid cloud formations and one leg was cut off to make Control Point # 1 on time. Control Point # 2 was made 12 minutes early because of difference in wind at the higher altitude. Also we were 9 minutes ahead of "A" task force leader so a 360° turn was made and we fell in behind the leader placing us in # 2 position of the task force (briefed # 3).

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

The flight to target was nearly as briefed except that all points were early due to difference in wind from metro forecast. The lead was turned over to the GH ship approximately 7 minutes before the IP and unsuccessful GH run was made and it was decided to bomb secondary PFF; a run was made and bombs dropped.

b. Bombing Run:

The group leader could get no weather report from the Scouting force but since the general area was covered the group leader turned the lead over to the GH ship which was our deputy. They came in about 2 miles south of the IP and turned on the run. A few minutes before bombs away they started to make a 360° turn to the left. The leader called and they said they were going to go back and make another pass at the target because something had gone wrong with the GH equipment. Halfway around the 360° turn, the GH equipment went out entirely so the formation completed the turn and then the lead ship took over the lead again. The leader headed for ~~the~~ Seigan which was the pre-determined IP in case the group was to attack the secondary target from the east. The formation made the IP good and came in on a PFF run on Koblenz, the secondary target. The

undercast was 10/10ths. The bombs were dropped by PFF. The group leader salvoed; the High and Low squadron leaders salvoed on his smoke marker; all others used a 75 ft. intervalometer setting. The AFCE was OK. Results were unobserved. (Due to the fact that only five A/C were in the low squadron it tacked on to the lead squadron and bombed in that manner)

c. Flight from Target:

The flight from the target was not as briefed due to a exceptionally great wind drift. Correction was made and control Point # 3 was made good 12 minutes late. The briefed course was flown except for one instance when it was necessary to deviate to get around a cumulus cloud formation. Let down was made over channel to about 6,000' at English Coast.

d. Return to Base:

The briefed course was flown to Newmarket and then it was decided to go directly to base because of shortage of gasoline and because the other groups based in this vicinity would have already landed. Three A/C found it necessary to land in Belgium--A/C 468 refueled and then returned--A/C 160 landed at Y-29 and was abandoned, the crew returning by ATC. The other A/C (42-97869) is unaccounted for. All others landed safely at home base.

e. Weather:

Weather was described as 8/10ths to 10/10ths high cloud over England, tops to 22-24,000 feet; nil to 3/10ths over channel, also extremely low cumulus. 5/10ths cumulus over continent to 0400E, area, tops to 15,000 ft. Dense persistent contrails which decreased ~~km~~ to light over target. Same on return.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was adequate.

g. Comments on Formation:

Formation was fair considering the weather conditions that were encountered.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

i. Screening Force:

Twelve A/C of the Screening Force took off and flew the briefed course to the target. It was difficult to maintain briefed timings due to the 1st Division being off. However, the chaff was dropped as briefed and all ships followed the briefed route home. No unusual circumstances were encountered.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

Low Squadron:

- A/C 43-37628 - Not Sortie. Returned when # 1 engine was failing -- possibly hit by .50 cal. shell as evidenced by large hole in cylinder.
- A/C 43-31891 - Not Sortie. Returned early when entire oxygen system went out-- pressure dropped to 70 lbs.
- A/C 43-38637 - Not Sortie. After late takeoff pilot found formation, then lost it. Could find no other group, hence returned.
- A/C 43-38541 - Sortie. Pilot could not find 94th "A" formation but flew with screening force until ^{it} was near the target. Returned bombs.

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Due to complete undercast results were unobserved.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C EET and bombed the secondary target, dropping 456 X 100# GP's thereupon. A/C 160 flew with another group and is included in above figures.

Low Squadron:

Of the 12 A/C taking off and EET six bombed the secondary target-- 5 with 401st and A/C 393 with 351st, dropping a total of 225 X 100# GP on target. A/C 398 bombed with "Square A" group of 3rd Division dropping 38 bombs at 5011-0626 -- A/C 662 bombed with the 92nd group at 4947-0634, dropping 38 bombs at that point. A/C 891 and 637 returned a total of 76 bombs. A/C 541 failed to find the 94th "A" group formation and flew with the screening force-- it returned 38 bombs. - 4 -

SUBJECT: Crew Comments and Suggestions.

TO : Commanding Officer, Station 128, APO 357, U.S. Army.

1. Lt. Joseph L. Brower, Pilot A/C 7367, observed that the landing procedure utilized when the formation returned to this station did not account for prevailing winds, with the result that the formation drifted about twice as far away from the field as it should have.

2. Lt. Richard D. Richardson, Pilot A/C 8434, stated that the Lead Sq. climbed into the High Sq. over Gottenmore buncher, causing the High Sq. to catch prop-wash.

3. Comments concerning the fact that the formation was flying at speeds from 168 to 175 (IAS) over the target, with the result that A/C were stringing out, were made by Lt. George E. Cracraft, Lt. Romie E. Armis, Lt. Carl P. Carey, Lt. Carl P. Djernes, Lt. Audrey J. Bradley and Lt. Robert E. Jordan.

4. Lt. Adolph A. Wolf, Pilot A/C 5125, criticized the leadership ability of Lt. Carl P. Djernes (No. 4, Low section, Low Sq.), stating that Lt. Djernes caused the flight to lag far behind the formation. Lt. Wolf also commented that A/C 2463 (Lt. Djernes) bombed early, dropping on the Lead Sq.

5. Lt. Laurel A. Turk, Pilot A/C 8941, reported that the High flight of the Lead Sq. dropped some bombs just after the formation had bombed, while the group was turning. He reported that some of the bombs did not miss his wing tip more than 20 feet, and recommends that whenever A/C drop bombs under similar conditions, the airplane commander institute a check to see whether or not any A/C are apt to be hit.

6. Lt. Luther A. Douglas, Pilot A/C 1591, reported that the ball-turret in the deputy lead A/C of the High Sq. did not move, either enroute out or back.

7. The crew of Lt. Walter W. Thorne, Pilot A/C 7029, waited over an hour for transportation from dispersal area No. 11.

8. Lt. Russell B. Thompson, Pilot A/C 2659, had only two complete flak suits for his entire crew. His crew believes that 2 cookies per person is an inadequate food ration for an 3 hour mission.
