ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: HERMULHEIM, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the 94th "A" Group. One PFF A/C was included in the lead and high squadrons and a GH A/C (from 379th Group) was included in the lead squadron. A spare accompanied each formation.

3. Flight Over England:
 - a. Takeoff:

Takeoff was accomplished before daylight and the ships climbed through a layer of cloud to assemble at 18000'.

3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

Due to a maximum gas load and having to climb so high to assemble, the time allotted for group assembly was inadequate. Accordingly, at briefed departure time the group was only about half formed. Therefore, the group leader decided to continue circling the buncher until the group was formed and to make up the time by cutting short the route over England.

c. Route Over England:

The other two groups in the Wing were notified that we would pick them up on time at point before the Division assembly line. This point was made good and 94th "B" was picked up okay. 94th "C" came up from behind a little later on. The wing joined the Division assembly line one minute early, in proper place behind the 40th CBW.

4. Attack:

a. Flight To Target:

Flight to target was uneventful. Due to slightly stronger tail wind than briefed we continued to gain time along with the rest of the Division. The weather was excellent with no contrails - as had been predicted - and formation all the way in was good. The Gee-H operator took over direction of the ship before the IP and began his run.

b. Bombing Run:

The solid undercast all the way to the target necessitated the use of mickey to get to the IP. With the squadrons in group formation and the lead ship on AFCE the GH navigator took over and made the bomb run. As indices met bombs were salvoed. The remainder of the formation dropped on the lead with a 75' intervalometer setting. Results were unobserved.

c. Flight From Target:

After "bombs away" a turn to the right off the target was made. A 40th CBW Group prevented our turning off as sharply as briefed, but practically no flak came up in the target area. Route out to continental coast was flown as briefed.

d. Return to Base:

Before continental coast "Cycle Relay" gave weather conditions out over the channel as a guide in returning to base. This group decided to come in under the clouds. Visibility was bad for a while near the English coast, but cleared up as the base was approached. Normal landing was made with exception of lead Gee-H ship which returned to Kimbolton.

e. Weather:

Described as 10/10ths cloud coverage over continent enroute to target, tops to 10,000', same over target. Enroute back, two layers cloud cover, tops of lower layer at 3500', upper layer 5,000' to 5,500'.

f. Fighter Support:

As briefed.

4. g. Comments on Formation:

Good most of the way in and out except on return over England where poor visibility caused it to spread out.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

When ships have maximum gas load and are to assemble at high altitudes, 10 more minutes should be allowed to assemble the groups.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

Lead Squadron: A/C 42-31072 - Not Sortie. Returned early when oil pressure dropped to 40 lbs. when props were lowered to 2300rpm. Cylinder heads temperature went down to 140°C. Engine checked okay on ground and on flight check. Crew changed to ground spare but did not get off in time to catch formation.
(Personnel)

Low Squadron: A/C 42-102947 - Not Sortie. Returned early when #2 engine oil pressure dropped to 40 lbs and temp. went up over 100. Fine metal particles were found in sump plug and also brase particles in cuno. Internal failure of #2 engine. (Mechanical)

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Solid undercast over target prevented any observation of results, however, a very good bombing run was made.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron: 11 A/C EET and attacked the target dropping 129 X 500# RDX bombs. Aborting A/C #072 returned its 12 bombs and the spare also returned 12 bombs to base. (Incl 36 EPR)

Low Squadron: 12 A/C EET and attacked target dropping 144 X 500# RDX bombs. Aborting A/C #947 returned 12 bombs to base. (Incl 15 EPR)

High Squadron: 13 A/C EET and attacked the target dropping 149 X 500# RDS bombs. (Incl spare which filled in on lead sqdn) One A/C (#151) returned 6 bombs to base because of release trouble.

SUBJECT: Crew Comments and Suggestions.

TO : Commanding Officer, Station 128, APO 887, U.S. Army.

1. Lt. Joseph L. Grewer, Pilot A/C 7947, observed that the landing procedure utilized when the formation returned to this station did not account for prevailing winds, with the result that the formation drifted about twice as far away from the field as it should have.

2. Lt. Richard B. Richardson, Pilot A/C 8484, stated that the Lead Sq. climbed into the High Sq. over Cottessmore Rancher, causing the High Sq. to catch prop-wash.

3. Comments concerning the fact that the formation was flying at speeds from 165 to 175 (IAS) over the target, with the result that A/C were stringing out, were made by Lt. George E. Greer, Lt. Romie E. Annis, Lt. Carl F. Carey, Lt. Carl P. Djernes, Lt. Audrey J. Bradley and Lt. Robert E. Jordan.

4. Lt. Adolph A. Wolf, Pilot A/C 3125, criticized the leadership ability of Lt. Carl P. Djernes (No. 4, Low section, Low Sq.), stating that Lt. Djernes caused the flight to lag far behind the formation. Lt. Wolf also commented that A/C 2468 (Lt. Djernes) bombed early, dropping on the Lead Sq.

5. Lt. Laurel A. Turk, Pilot A/C 3942, reported that the High flight of the Lead Sq. dropped some bombs just after the formation had bombed, while the Group was turning. He reported that some of the bombs did not miss his wing tip more than 20 feet, and recommends that whenever A/C drop bombs under similar conditions, the airplane commander institute a check to see whether or not any A/C are apt to be hit.

6. Lt. Luther A. Douglas, Pilot A/C 1891, reported that the ball-turret in the deputy lead A/C of the High Sq. did not move, either enroute out or back.

7. The crew of Lt. Walter W. Thorne, Pilot A/C 7039, waited over an hour for transportation from dispersal area No. 11.

8. Lt. Russell B. Thompson, Pilot A/C 2659, had only two complete flak suits for his entire crew. His crew believes that 2 cookies per person is an inadequate food ration for an 8 hour mission.

TO : Commanding Officer, Station 128, APO 557, U.S. Army.

1. Lt. Robert L. Long, Pilot A/C 6992, criticized the fact that the Group was off course, made too many 360° and went over Koblenz flak area. Lt. Dale G. Jones, Pilot A/C 7628, seconded this observation, as did Lt. Andrew F. Bloetscher, Pilot A/C 1891 and the crew of Lt. George K. Cracraft, Pilot A/C 1893.
2. F/O Herbert P. Cox, Pilot A/C 160 stated that Lt. Hopley (No. 2, Low section of High Sq.) flew out of position all day.
3. Lt. Herman Tausig, Pilot A/C 8160, criticized the fact that Lt. Aschenbach (No. 1, High Fligh, Lead Sq.) kept forcing him out of position, flying too close to the Lead Flight of the Squadron.
4. Lt. Edward E. Curran, Pilot A/C 1072, said that his A/C was riding in prop-wash, making it difficult to fly formation, because the High Squadron Leader was down too close to the Lead Squadron.
5. Lt. Walter E. Cox, Pilot A/C 1662, could not appreciate the necessity of following the Group Leader over the Last Resort target, inasmuch as his Squadron (the Low Sq.) had already dropped their bombs.
6. Lt. Donald R. Scheller, Pilot A/C 6113, also criticized the formation flying of Lt. Aschenbach.
7. Lt. Tausig reported that the weather information which his RO received from the Deenethorpe Weather Station was highly inaccurate. Lt. Tausig's A/C had been hit by flak, his radio compass and VHF were both inoperative, and the incorrect weather information made it exceedingly difficult for him to lead the High Squadron back to this station and land them.
8. Lt. Tausig also reported that his A/C was short two flak suits today.
9. Lt. Alfred R. Grimm, Pilot A/C 8810, stated that breakfast this morning was very poor, his crew-members being unable to eat the poorly cooked eggs and potatoes.
10. Lt. Rommie E. Annis, Pilot A/C 7706, also confirmed Lt. Tausig's complaint that weather information on conditions at this station was completely wrong.
