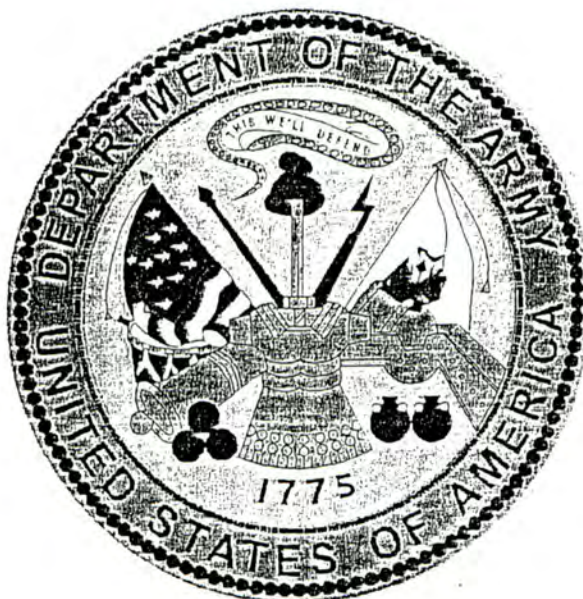

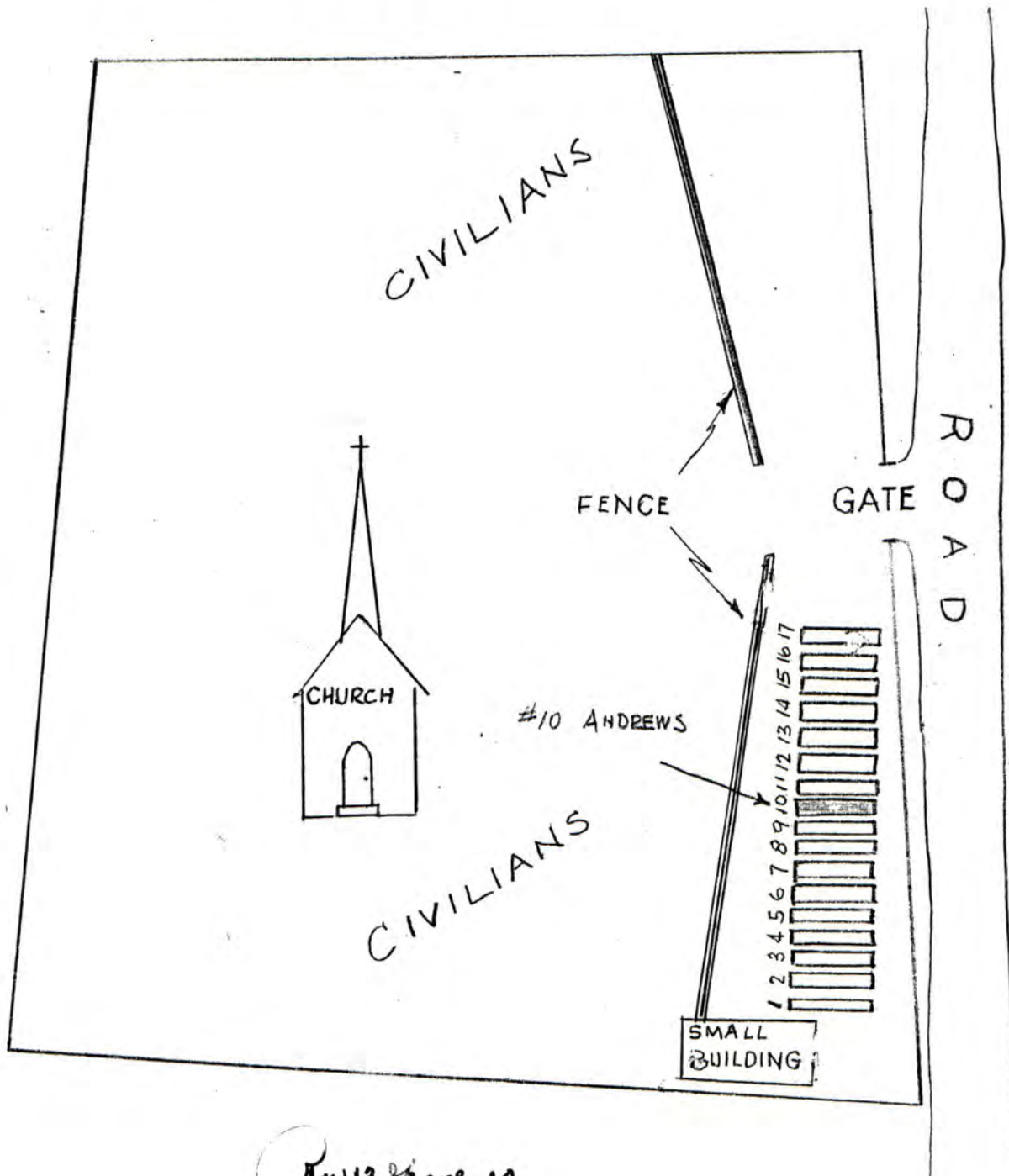

Dear Mrs. Andrews:

The people of the United States, through the Congress have authorized the disinterment and final burial of the heroic dead of World War II. The Quartermaster General of the Army has been entrusted with this sacred responsibility to the honored dead. The records of the War Department indicate that you may be the nearest relative of the above-named deceased, who gave his life in the service of his country.

The enclosed pamphlets, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," and "American Cemeteries," explain the disposition, options and services made available to you by your Government. If you are the next of kin according to the line of kinship as set forth in the enclosed pamphlet, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," you are invited to express your wishes as to the disposition of the remains of the deceased by completing Part I of the enclosed form "Request for Disposition of Remains." Should you desire to relinquish your rights to the next in line of kinship, please complete Part II of the enclosed form. If you are not the next of kin, please complete Part III of the enclosed form.

If you should elect Option 2, it is advised that no funeral arrangements or other personal arrangements be made until you are further notified by this office.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.

Dear Mr. Andrews:

Your letter to The Adjutant General concerning your son, the late Technical Sergeant Robert C. Andrews, has been referred to this office.

The official report of burial shows that the remains of your son were originally interred in the Cemetery Poppingawier, Netherlands, but were later disinterred and moved to a more suitable site where constant care of the grave can be assured by our Forces in the field.

The report of burial further discloses that the remains of your son are now interred in plot TT, row 1, grave 21, in the United States Military Cemetery Margraten, Holland, located ten miles west of Aachen, Germany.

The War Department has now been authorized to remove, at Government expense, to the final resting place designated by the next of kin, the remains of those American citizens who died while serving overseas with our armed forces during this war.

When the necessary preliminaries have been completed, a letter with an information pamphlet and a "Request for Disposition" form attached will be sent to the next of kin of those American dead. The "Request for Disposition" form, when properly filled out, will constitute the formal expression of the next of kin's detailed desires. Since letters to the next of kin will be dispatched automatically and according to the records here, communications with this office regarding this subject will not be necessary.

As you probably know, the supply of steel for the manufacture of caskets, is at present uncertain. Without this essential item, the movement of remains cannot properly be initiated. This fact and the

Dear Mr. Andrews:

I am referring to your letter of 26 October 1945, concerning your son, the late Technical Sergeant Robert C. Andrews.

The distress you have suffered since receiving the sad announcement of your son's death is most understandable and your desire to learn the details thereof is realized fully. According to translated captured German documents Sergeant Andrews' death occurred on 16 December 1943 at about 2:00 p.m., as the result of a skull fracture sustained when the B-17 (Flying Fortress) bomber on which he was serving crashed at Poppingawier, Netherlands. This information was conveyed to your daughter-in-law, Mrs. Mary E. Andrews, in a letter dated 1 February 1946, from Brigadier General Leon W. Johnson, a copy of which was furnished this office.

The records of this office disclose that there were no survivors of the crew with whom Sergeant Andrews was serving on 16 December 1943.

Matters pertaining to the burial and the return of the remains of our military personnel who die overseas are handled by The Quartermaster General, Washington 25, D. C., and a copy of your letter is being forwarded to that official for appropriate attention.

The death of your son is deeply regretted and I realize how futile any words of mine may be to assuage your grief but I trust that the knowledge of his heroic sacrifice in action may be a source of sustaining comfort.

You have my heartfelt sympathy in your bereavement.

BURGERMEESTER REPORT

3955 COMMUNITY OF RAUWERDERHEM, HOLLAND

Thursday, 16 December 1943, about 14:15 hours P.M. two American Bombers came down in the community of Rauwerderhem. One was burning and the other exploded in the air.

Five burned bodies were found under and in the burned plane. Also the bodies of seven other pilots were found about one hundred yards away from the plane.

Three other bodies were found on 29 December and also two others on 5th of January under the pieces of the burned plane.



Your letter to The Adjutant General concerning your son, the late Technical Sergeant Robert C. Andrews, has been referred to this office.

The official report of burial shows that the remains of your son were originally interred in the Cemetery Poppingawier, Netherlands, but were later disinterred and moved to a more suitable site where constant care of the grave can be assured by our Forces in the field.

The report of burial further discloses that the remains of your son are now interred in plot TT, row 1, grave 21, in the United States Military Cemetery Margraten, Holland, located ten miles west of Aachen, Germany.

The War Department has now been authorized to remove, at Government expense, to the final resting place designated by the next of kin, the remains of those American citizens who died while serving overseas with our armed forces during this war.

When the necessary preliminaries have been completed, a letter with an information pamphlet and a "Request for Disposition" form attached will be sent to the next of kin of those American dead. The "Request for Disposition" form, when properly filled out, will constitute the formal expression of the next of kin's detailed desires. Since letters to the next of kin will be dispatched automatically and according to the records here, communications with this office regarding this subject will not be necessary.

As you probably know, the supply of steel for the manufacture of caskets, is at present uncertain. Without this essential item, the movement of remains cannot properly be initiated. This fact and the

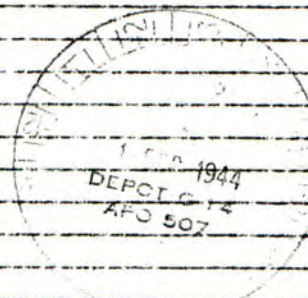



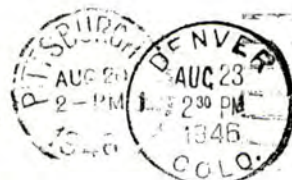

Dear Mrs. Andrews:

I am writing to you in reference to your husband who gave his life in the service of his Country during the European conflict.

In an effort to furnish the next of kin with all available details concerning casualties among our personnel, the Army Air Forces recently completed the translation of several volumes of captured German records.

In regard to your husband, Technical Sergeant Robert Callender Andrews, these records indicate that he died 16 December 1943 about 2:00 p.m. as a result of a skull fracture sustained in the crash of his B-17 (Flying Fortress). The cause of the crash was not disclosed but occurred at Poppingawier, Netherlands. His body was interred 21 December 1943 in the Poppingawier Cemetery, row 30, grave 1. Poppingawier is located nine miles south of Leeuwarden, Netherlands.

The Quartermaster General in his capacity as Chief, American Graves Registration Service, is charged with the responsibility of notifying the legal next of kin concerning grave locations of members of the military forces who are killed or die outside the continental limits of the United States. If the report of your husband's burial has not been confirmed and you have not been notified by the Quartermaster General, that official will furnish you definite information immediately upon receipt of the official report of interment from the Commanding General of the Theater concerned.

May the knowledge of your husband's valuable contribution to our cause sustain you in your bereavement.
