1. The Board convened, pursuant to par 2, SO 8, Headquarters, 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, APO 757, US Army, 19 January 1951, at Liege, Belgium on 10 April 1951.

2. Members present:

3. PURPOSE: To review and determine, from evidence presented, the non-recoverability of the remains of World War II dead lost in the geographical area described below:

a. Vicinity Drosling, Germany (M-49), Case #6229

b. FACTS:

Sgts. Charles R. Marshall, 35772708 and Jerome E. Kiger, 15320366, were two (2) of nine (9) crew members aboard aircraft B-24H, #42-50433, which crashed in the vicinity of Drosling, Germany on 21 July 1944.

4. FINDINGS:

a. Six (6) of the referenced aircraft crew members have returned to military control. There is no information presently available relative to their survival and the missing status of personnel named.

b. The remains of the ninth crew member, Sgt. Glickman, were recovered at Hadorf and reinterred in USMC St. Avold. Hadorf is in the proximity of Drosling, Germany.

c. A Field Investigation conducted on 19 July 1949, resulted in locating the site where the aircraft crashed. A witness reported having seen partial human remains in the wreckage while German army personnel were occupied in clearing away large parts of the wreck and filling in a crater caused by the crash. However, the disposition of these remains is unknown.

Non-Recoverable Board Proceedings (Cont'd)

Dulag records which record the crash site, make no reference to remains found or the names of personnel who survived.

d. The crater was excavated on 29 July 1949 but only small parts of the aircraft were found and it was evident that the plane did not bury itself into the ground on crashing. Hearsay information among the local population indicates the aircraft crashed with a full bomb load.

e. Attempts by this headquarters to associate subject casualties with remains of unknown deceased, have proven negative. There is no record of unknown deceased recovered in the immediate vicinity of the crash site.

f. Reference is also made to: Narrative Reports of Field Investigations, dated 19 and 22 July 1949, attached.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS: That the remains of the decedents considered herein be determined non-recoverable.

I. AUTHORITY AND MATTERS INVESTIGATED

1. To obtain information concerning Sergeants Charles R. Marshall, 35772706 and Jerome E. Kiger, 15320366, crew members of B-24 bomber, No. 42-50433 supposedly lost on 21 July 1944 in the vicinity of Aufkirchen (M-48/Y-73) (Exhibit "A").

II. FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES

2. The only information available in the Aufkirchen area was of four parachutists who were taken prisoner. Nothing was known as to where the plane crashed.

3. At Hadorf it was learned that a plane had crashed near Drossling (M-49/Y-64) in July 1944 and that the body recovered from Hadorf (Sgt. Glickman) was from this plane. A witness, Martin Biechle, then burgermeister of Drossling, saw two persons descending by parachute; one of these was Glickman. The other was taken by German military personnel to the scene of crash and stated that this was his ship. Biechle was at the scene half an hour after the crash and saw parts of human remains, but did not know what happened to them. The German army personnel cleared away the larger parts of the wreck and partially filled in the hole. According to local residents, no excavation work has been done on this crater.

III. FINDINGS

4. That the bomber which crashed 2½ or 3 kms southeast of Drossling was probably the one in this case.

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REPORT OF INVESTIGATION

5. That some remains of identifying objects may still be in the crater.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

6. That the plane crater be excavated. Location is shown on the attached sketch (Exhibit "D").
