Dear Mrs. Scollon:

I am writing to you in reference to your son who gave his life in the service of his Country during the European conflict.

Information has been received indicating that Staff Sergeant James Scollon, Jr. was a waist gunner on a B-17 (Flying Fortress) bomber which departed from Ridgewell, England on a bombardment mission to Amiens, France on 14 July 1943. The report reveals that during this mission Sergeant Scollon's plane was last sighted near Amiens, France. The circumstances surrounding its loss are not known; however, further information has been received which indicates that these were no survivors.

In an effort to furnish the next of kin with all available details concerning casualties among our personnel, the Army Air Forces recently completed the translation of several volumes of captured German records.

In regard to your son, these records indicate that he was killed on 14 July 1943, when his bomber crashed in the vicinity of Bois-Jean (50° 24' N, 1° 46' E), France. There were ten crew members participating in this mission, all of whom are listed as dead in these records. Identity of six was established and the remaining four were unidentified. Since your son's name was not listed as one of the identified, it can be assumed that he was one of the unknown. These records further state that interment was made in the local cemetery at Berck-Plage, a suburb of Berck-Ville (50° 24' N - 1° 34' E), France.

The Quartermaster General in his capacity as Chief, American Graves Registration Service, is charged with the responsibility of notifying the next of kin concerning grave locations of members of the military forces who are killed or die outside the continental limits of the United States. The Quartermaster General will furnish you with definite information of your son's burial location, should this information be received from the Commanding General of the Theater concerned.
