The Quartermaster General of the Army has been entrusted with this sacred responsibility to the honored dead. The records of the War Department indicate that you may be the nearest relative of the above-named deceased, who gave his life in the service of his country.

The enclosed pamphlets, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," and "American Cemeteries," explain the disposition, options and services made available to you by your Government. If you are the next of kin according to the line of kinship as set forth in the enclosed pamphlet, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," you are invited to express your wishes as to the disposition of the remains of the deceased by completing Part I of the enclosed form "Request for Disposition of Remains." Your inquiry directed to the Headquarters Army Air Forces has been referred to this office for reply to information concerning your son, the late Flight Officer Hugh X. O'Donnell.

In view of the fact that the Army Effects Bureau, Kansas City Quartermaster Depot, Kansas City 1, Missouri, has been designated to receive and ship the personal effects of our military personnel who die outside the United States, your letter has been referred to that office for a direct reply to you.

The official report of interment received at this office shows that the remains of your son were interred in the United States Military Cemetery, Margraten, Holland, Plot BB, Row 2, Grave 29. With reference to other larger cities the approximate location of Margraten, Holland is twelve miles northwest of Aachen, Germany and eight miles southeast of Maastricht, Holland.

This office regrets, sincerely, the delay in answering your letter and wishes to extend its deepest sympathy in the loss of your son.

In view of the fact that the Army Effects Bureau, Kansas City Quartermaster Depot, Kansas City 1, Missouri, has been designated to receive and ship the personal effects of our military personnel who die outside the United States, your letter has been referred to that office for a direct reply to you.

The official report of interment received at this office shows that the remains of your son were interred in the United States Military Cemetery, Margraten, Holland, Plot BB, Row 2, Grave 29. With reference to other larger cities the approximate location of Margraten, Holland is twelve miles northwest of Aachen, Germany and eight miles southeast of Maastricht, Holland.
