In view of the fact that the Army Effects Bureau, Kansas City Quartermaster Depot, Kansas City 1, Missouri, has been designated to receive and ship the personal effects of our military personnel who die outside the United States, your letter has been referred to that office for a direct reply to you.

The official report of interment received at this office shows that the remains of your son were interred in the United States Military Cemetery, Margraten, Holland, Plot BB, Row 2, Grave 29. With reference to other larger cities the approximate location of Margraten, Holland is twelve miles northwest of Aachen, Germany and eight miles southeast of Maastricht, Holland.
