Dear Mr. Taylor:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

The people of the United States, through the Congress have authorized the disinterment and final burial of the heroic dead of World War II. The Quartermaster General of the Army has been entrusted with this sacred responsibility to the honored dead. The records of the War Department indicate that you may be the nearest relative of the above-named deceased, who gave his life in the service of his country.

The enclosed pamphlets, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," and "American Cemeteries," explain the disposition, options and services made available to you by your Government. If you are the next of kin according to the line of kinship as set forth in the enclosed pamphlet, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," you are invited to express your wishes as to the disposition of the remains of the deceased by completing Part I of the enclosed form "Request for Disposition of Remains." Should you desire to relinquish your rights to the next in line of kinship, please complete Part II of the enclosed form. If you are not the next of kin, please complete Part III of the enclosed form.

If you should elect Option 2, it is advised that no funeral arrangements or other personal arrangements be made until you are further notified by this office.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.

Dear Mrs. Taylor:

Your letter to The Adjutant General concerning your son, the late Technical Sergeant Raymond H. Taylor, has been referred to this office.

The official Report of Burial discloses that the remains of your son were interred in Plot AA, Row 1, Grave 9, in the United States Military Cemetery, Margraten, Holland, located approximately twelve miles northwest of Aachen, Germany and eight miles southeast of Maastricht, Holland.

The War Department anticipates that, in the near future, authority will be granted to return at Government expense, the remains of those who died overseas to a final resting place as selected by the next of kin.

When the necessary legislation authorizing this Repatriation Program receives Congressional approval and other required arrangements have been made, a poll letter, with a return form and an information pamphlet attached, will be sent to the next of kin of each deceased serviceman whose remains lie overseas and for whom verified burial information has been received.

Since the problem itself, and the planning and arrangements therefor are world-wide in scope, the date when the poll letter can be mailed and the date when the answers will be received and can be acted upon is necessarily uncertain. It should be realized, however, that the next of kin will be notified without action on their part as soon as the necessary preliminaries have been completed. You may rest assured that this office fully appreciates your desires in this matter and will do everything in its power to fulfill them at the earliest possible date.

In view of the fact that the Army Effects Bureau, Kansas City Quartermaster Depot, 601 Hardesty Avenue, Kansas City 1, Missouri, has been designated to receive and ship personal effects of military personnel who died overseas, a copy of your letter has been forwarded to that office for direct reply to eliminate duplication of effort.

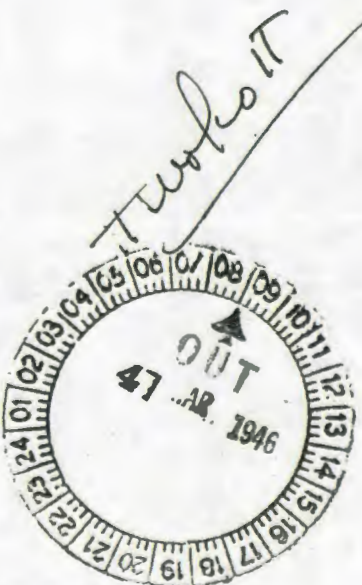

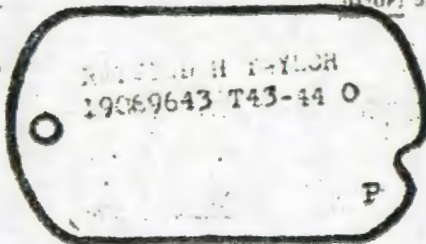

Your letter to The Adjutant General concerning your son, the late Technical Sergeant Raymond H. Taylor, has been referred to this office.

The official Report of Burial discloses that the remains of your son were interred in Plot AA, Row 1, Grave 9, in the United States Military Cemetery, Margraten, Holland, located approximately twelve miles northwest of Aachen, Germany and eight miles southeast of Maastricht, Holland.

The War Department anticipates that, in the near future, authority will be granted to return at Government expense, the remains of those who died overseas to a final resting place as selected by the next of kin.

When the necessary legislation authorizing this Repatriation Program receives Congressional approval and other required arrangements have been made, a poll letter, with a return form and an information pamphlet attached, will be sent to the next of kin of each deceased serviceman whose remains lie overseas and for whom verified burial information has been received.

Since the problem itself, and the planning and arrangements therefor are world-wide in scope, the date when the poll letter can be mailed and the date when the answers will be received and can be acted upon is necessarily uncertain. It should be realized, however, that the next of kin will be notified without action on their part as soon as the necessary preliminaries have been completed. You may rest assured that this office fully appreciates your desires in this matter and will do everything in its power to fulfill them at the earliest possible date.

In view of the fact that the Army Effects Bureau, Kansas City Quartermaster Depot, 601 Hardesty Avenue, Kansas City 1, Missouri, has been designated to receive and ship personal effects of military personnel who died overseas, a copy of your letter has been forwarded to that office for direct reply to eliminate duplication of effort.

2. 4. This office is unable to return currencies rejected by the respective countries concerned. Due to their extensively decomposed and highly contaminated condition, it was deemed advisable to destroy this worthless currency by burning. Dear Mr. Taylor:

The Army Effects Bureau recently received for disposal a group of funds which had been recovered by the American Graves Registration Service in its disinterment operations under the current Repatriation Program for deceased military personnel.

These funds, consisting of United States or foreign currencies, were carried by the soldier at the time of casualty and in many instances were recovered in a mutilated or unsightly condition.

Consolidation at the overseas headquarters was then made of all such currencies and it was then returned to the country of origin for exchange to dollar credits to enable issuance of a check replacing the mutilated currency.

Such was the case with some funds received for your son, the late Technical Sergeant Raymond H. Taylor.

I know that you want to receive these funds as soon as possible, but due to the time elapsed since the occurrence of the casualty, it is believed that some explanation should be offered as to the source of these funds and the delay in their transmittal.

It would be appreciated if you would confirm the accuracy of your address in order that the check may be delivered properly. A notation placed at the bottom of this letter will be sufficient and may be returned in the inclosed addressed envelope requiring no postage.

Upon receipt of your reply, a Bureau check for the funds recovered from the above source will then be sent you promptly.
