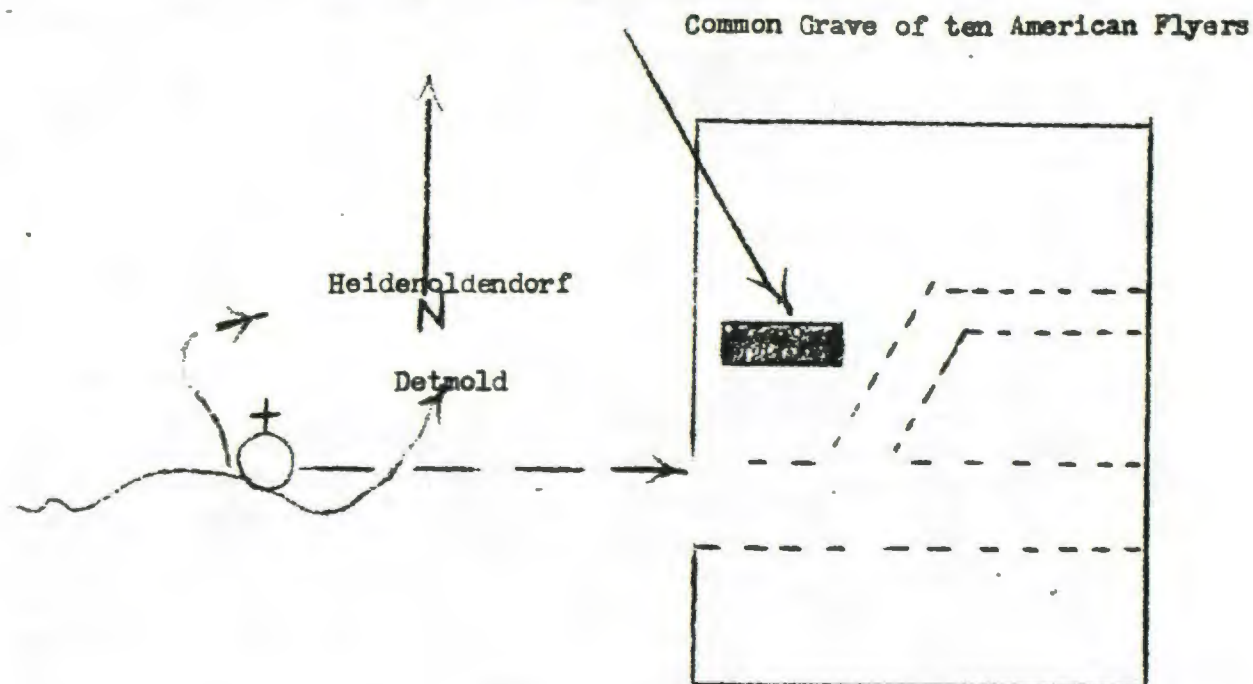

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

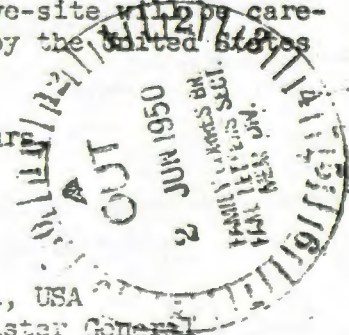
After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

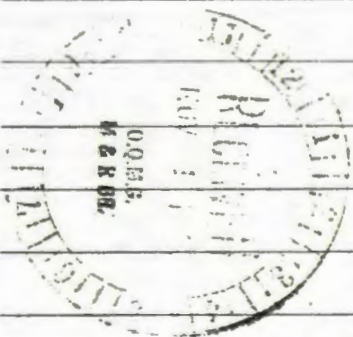

Dear Mr. Olney:

We are desirous that you be furnished information concerning the resting place of the remains of your son, the late Sergeant Reginald C. Olney.

The official report of burial has been received and discloses that the remains of your son were originally buried in the Civilian Cemetery at Lille, France, but were later disinterred by our American Graves Registration Personnel, properly identified, and reinterred in Plot I, Row 2, Grave 74, United States Military Cemetery, Neuville-en-Condroz, located nine miles southwest of Lille, Belgium.

The report further indicates that these remains have now been exhumed and are being held at that cemetery pending disposition instructions from the next of kin, either for return to the United States or for permanent burial in an overseas cemetery.

Enclosed are information pamphlets regarding the Return of Remains Program, including a Disposition Form on which you may indicate your desires in this matter. Upon receipt of the properly completed form, you may be assured that the Department of the Army will attempt to comply with your instructions as indicated thereon.

In order that this office may take immediate action toward the final disposition of the remains of your son, it is urged that you complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail it to this office, without delay, in the inclosed self-addressed envelope which requires no postage.

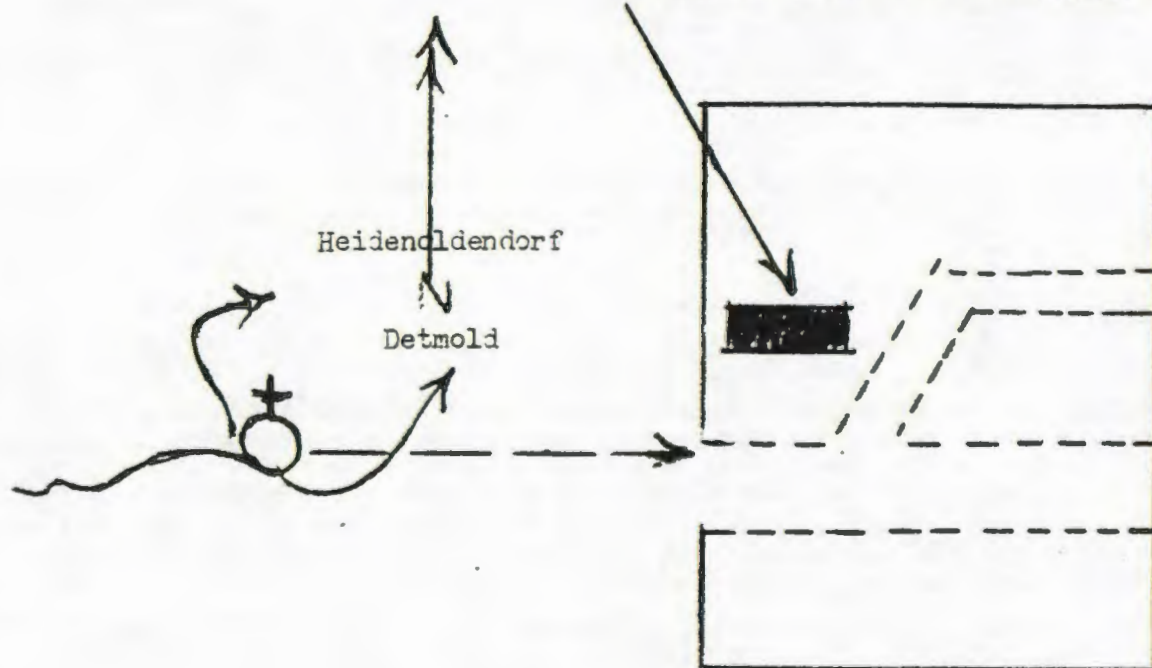

Dear Mrs. Solway:

I am writing to you in reference to your son who gave his life in the service of his Country during the European conflict.

In an effort to furnish the next of kin with all available details concerning casualties among our personnel, the Army Air Forces recently completed the translation of several volumes of captured German records.

In regard to your son, Sergeant Reginald G. Solway, these records indicate that he was killed 27 February 1944, when the B-17 (Flying Fortress) in which he was serving crashed at Hiddensee, (54° 30' N, 13° 5' E), Prussia. These records further state that of the ten crewmembers, there were three unknown recovered from the crash, one of whom was assumed to be your son. He was interred in the Community Cemetery of Hiddensen, 25 February 1944 at 5:30 p.m., in a single grave.

The Quartermaster General in his capacity as Chief, American Graves Registration Service, is charged with the responsibility of notifying the legal next of kin concerning grave locations of members of the military forces who are killed or die outside the continental limits of the United States. If the report of your son's burial has not been confirmed and you have not been notified by the Quartermaster General, that official will furnish you definite information immediately upon receipt of the official report of interment from the Commanding General of the Theater concerned.

May the knowledge of your son's valuable contribution to our cause sustain you in your bereavement.

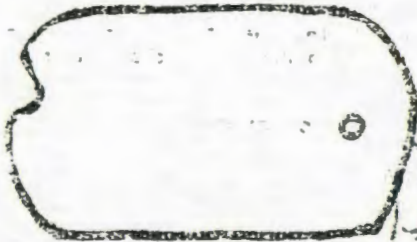
