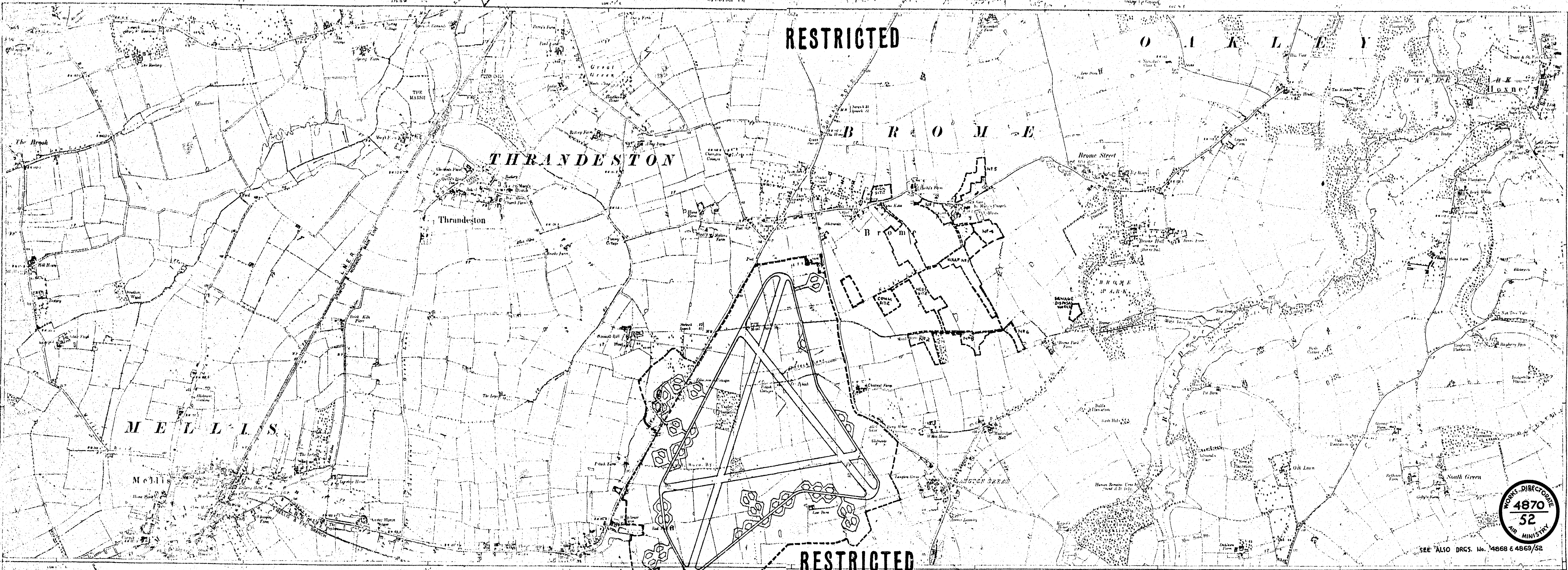




Scale: Six inches to One Statute Mile or 100 Feet to One Inch

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The altitudes of bench marks and surface heights are given in feet above the mean level of the sea at Newlyn, and are based on the revised primary levelling of 1922.

Altitudes indicated that a cross-section bench marks on buildings walls &c. those marked thus are followed to the height to surface level.
