Dear Mr. Higo:

This responds to your letter of July 21, 1946, requesting information pertaining to former American service members.

The names Grunholtz, Brown, and Adams are not on our alphabetical listing of American service members who died or were listed missing overseas during World War II. Perhaps they were the three persons referred to in the enclosed Memorandum For Record, June 7, 1948. One was transferred to a German hospital, the other two survived the incident. The files of the other six men contain the same basic information contained in the June 7, 1948 Memorandum. Their remains were temporarily interred in the Civilian Cemetery, Russelsheim, Germany. Subsequently they were removed to the U. S. Military Cemetery, St. Avold, France. Individual information extracted from their files is listed:

AGATH, Elmore L., SGT, 31 340 848, killed in action August 26, 1944, Russelsheim, Germany. Final interment was in the Maple Grove Cemetery, Packersfield, Vermont, in September 1948.

DUMONT, William A., SGT, 31 267 637, killed in action August 26, 1944, Russelsheim, Germany. Final interment was in the Mt. Calvary Cemetery, Berlin, New Hampshire, in September 1948.

✓ ROGERS, Norman J., Jr., 2LT, O 820 907, killed in action August 26, 1944, Russelsheim, Germany. Final interment was in plot D, row 3, grave 14, of the Lorraine Cemetery, St. Avold, France, in January 1949.

SERUL, John H., 2LT, O 824 262, killed in action August 26, 1944, Russelsheim, Germany. Final interment was in the St. Raymond's Cemetery, Bronx, New York, in September 1948.

TUFENKJIAN, Haigus, P/O, T 125 860, killed in action August 26, 1944, Russelsheim, Germany. Final interment was in plot E, row 48, grave 15, of the Lorraine Cemetery, St. Avold, France, in March 1949.

WILLIAMS, Thomas P., SGT, 15 100 217, killed in action August 21, 1944, Russelsheim, Germany. Final interment was in plot E, row 44, grave 17, of the Lorraine Cemetery, St. Avold, France, in March 1945.

The files contain no information relating to the associations of the men prior to the crash of their aircraft.

Mr. W. G. Ramsey, "After the Battle", 5 New Fleistow Road, Stratford, London E 15 3JA, Great Britain, has done research on this incident. He might be a source of information.

I hope this information will be helpful.

1. Reference is made to carrier note of this branch to you, subject as above, under date of 4 March 1946, relative to the requirements of the message from AGWAR, signed HATAG, reference number WX-92062, 21 February 1946, cite WFO-1, directing that it is essential that steps be taken to inform the War Department when there is evidence on which a death report can be made so that the next of kin may be notified prior to the release of any publicity concerning the same during or as a result of war crimes trials.

2. The case of the United States versus Franz SEITZ, File No. 12-1497 (P), is being prepared for trial. Information contained in the file discloses that the following evidence indicating the death of American prisoners of war may be introduced at the trial:

a. The evidence indicates that eight American Prisoners of War were beaten by German civilians including the above named defendant of SEITZ, Germany, with sticks, stones, clubs, and iron pipes in the streets of SEITZ, Germany on or about 26 August 1944. Six of the eight victims died as a result of injuries inflicted. Four of these have been identified as John F. BUKUL, William A. DUNNONT, Thomas D. WILLIAMS, and Elmer L. BEE, all members of the U.S. Air Forces. The two other deceased may have been named Norman J. YOUNG and Forrest A. BAINBRISTOL. The two living victims, Sidney D. BROWN and William M. ADAMS, escaped and were returned to the United States.

1. B-24 aircraft No. 42-110107 crashed 24 Aug 1944 in Germany. Of its nine man crew, three members were captured and have returned to the United States, and the remaining six members were captured and are now carried as killed in action on 26 Aug 1944. One of the nine men was seriously wounded before the aircraft crashed and when captured, was transferred to a German hospital. The remaining eight men were confined at a German Air Base during the night of 24 Aug 1944. Early on the morning of 25 Aug 1944 they were placed on a train and traveled until approximately 0600 hours on 26 Aug 1944. In custody of the Gestapo, they then began walking and while enroute passed through the town of Russelsheim, Germany which had been heavily bombed the preceding night. Citizens of the town attacked the eight men and beat six of them to death. An air raid saved the lives of the remaining two men.

2. The nine men were reported missing in action on the date their aircraft crashed and were presumed dead one year later under Public Law 490, as amended. Upon later recovery of the bodies, the field reported the six men killed in action on 24 Aug 1944, the date they became missing. Statements by the survivors, information from residents of Russelsheim, Germany, and information from captured German records established the date and details of death as are outlined in paragraph No. 1, and resulted in War Crimes action. Based upon accumulated information and details, The Adjutant General's Office initiated memorandums (SD Case 6306) indicating that subject men were killed in action on 26 Aug 1944.

3. Each Casualty 201 file in this case contains a Burial Report for the man concerned. The Burial Reports were completed when the bodies of subject men were recovered. The exact date of death of the men was not then known and since people in Russelsheim, Germany indicated that "26 or 28 Aug 1944" was the date of death, that notation was entered on the Burial Report as "estimated". Further, some of the Burial Reports contain the statement "The exact date of death and date of burial is not known." An examination of the six Burial Reports shows a confusion of changes and corrections in the "26 or 28 Aug 1944." On some Burial Reports the date remains 26 or 28 Aug 1944, while on others it has been changed to 24 Aug 1944.

to 28 Aug 1944. This variety of changes and notations definitely indicates that the exact date of death was not known and could not be determined when the bodies were recovered. It is noted that little weight of consideration need ordinarily be given an "estimated" date of death which conflicts with a specific date of death shown on other available records. In this case it is concluded that available evidence supports no other conclusion than that subject men were killed in action when they were beaten to death on 26 Aug 1944 by German civilians.

4. It is therefore recommended that no action be taken to change the date of death of subject men from 26 Aug 1944.

The captured German Record KU 2809, contains a list of the nine members of the crew, indicating that they were captured. See Exhibit - A. Also recorded on KU 2809, which was compiled on 26 August - 7,30 Mainz - Bischofsheim, 9000 at Russelsheim, is a list of the crew members and their dates of birth.

Comparison is made of the height, weight and tooth charts for F/O Tufenkjian and Lt. Rogers, with those submitted for the Unknowns. See Exhibit - B.

In view of the fact that the height, weight and dental chart for Unknown X-891 compares very favorably with that of Tufenkjian, it is determined that the remains interred in Plot PFP, Row 2, Grave 13, are those of F/O Haigus Tufenkjian, T-125660.

Inasmuch as the tooth chart and weight of Unknown X-892 compare favorably with that of Lt. Rogers, the laundry mark "N. J. Rogers", found on the flying suit, coincides with his name, and by process of elimination, it is determined that the remains interred in Plot PFP, Row 2, Grave 14, are those of 2nd Lt. Norman J. Rogers, Jr., O-820907.

The above identifications are further substantiated by the fact that other members of the crew were disinterred from the same common grave.

Reference is made to your communication received in this office 3 April 1944 with inclosure dated 2 April 1946 from Mrs. Norman J. Rogers concerning her son, Second Lieutenant Norman J. Rogers, Jr.

The Adjutant General, who is responsible for reporting the change of status of military personnel, issued a report that Lieutenant Rogers was killed in action in Germany on 24 August 1944. This report superseded the report of finding of death which had been issued in regard to Lieutenant Rogers under Public Law 490, 77th Congress, as amended. Evidence to substantiate the issuance of the report of death was received from the Commanding General of The European Theater of Operations concerned. I have forwarded a copy of your letter to The Adjutant General with a request that reply be made direct to Mrs. Rogers regarding the evidence on which the report was based.

This office is in receipt of information from the survivors of Lieutenant Rogers' aircraft to the effect that Lieutenant Rogers together with five of his crew members was subjected to civilian violence at Russelsheim, Germany following their capture by the Germans. The survivors further state that they witnessed the violence and that Lieutenant Rogers was left in a cemetery supposedly dead. This office has been advised by the Civil Affairs Division, War Department General Staff, Washington, D. C., formerly designated as the War Crimes Commission, that charges had been preferred against the German civilians responsible for these atrocities against the six members of the crew which included Lieutenant Rogers. On 5 March 1946 a request was made to the Commanding General of the Theater of Operations concerned for a full and con-

plate report concerning the disposition of the case. Reply has not been received to date. However, when a reply is received, this office will communicate the details to Mrs. Rogers.

Military personnel are fingerprinted at the time of induction and the fingerprints are made a part of the permanent official military record. In addition to fingerprint charts which are made immediately available for identification purposes, dental charts are also used.

The Quartermaster General is charged with the responsibility of notifying the legal next of kin concerning grave locations of deceased members of the military forces who are killed or die outside the continental limits of the United States. A copy of Mrs. Rogers' letter has been forwarded to that official for direct reply.

These convey to Mrs. Rogers my deepest sympathy in the loss of her son.

Dear Sir:

Learning of your interest in locating the missing men of our last war, I am taking the liberty of bringing my problem to your attention.

My son, Lt. Norman J. Rogers was declared missing on August 24th, 1944. A year later he was presumed dead. Still later we received an official notice that he died or rather was killed in action on August 24th 1944. In the meantime we had heard the story of his death and accepted the "presumed" notice, thinking that in time we would be notified of the true facts. However, we are not satisfied with the official report because it isn't true and it leaves us without knowing where his body lies.

It seems to us that without too much trouble, the war dep't could give us the truth and I have written the facts to them but I guess as far as they are concerned, the case is closed.

The facts are as follows:- On August 24th 1944, two days after our son's bomber was shot down, six of his crew were mobbed and killed by German civilians in Russelsheim, Germany. Four were identified, my son and his bombardier - navigator, being found without their identification tags. Are there no other means of identifying the boys? Cannot they be fingerprinted?

The story is true because we knew all members of his crew and originally eight were attacked after a ninth had been taken to hospital for wounds. The eight were left for dead in a cemetery and two escaped. Those two were captured and served as prisoners of war and finally returned and told us the story. They also told their story to the commission in charge in France after being liberated, but still we get a false "official" notice.

If we do not hear any more, could you find out for us if the two unidentified boys are buried with their four buddies? In that way we can find out from their relatives where they are buried.

At the time of the trials of the Germans, the newspapers carried the four boys names and we know them well. We have a picture of the crew and know that we have received a true story.

Please help us to have our boy officially identified and his grave marked with his name. In future years we may be able to visit it.

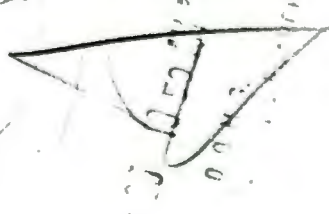

Further reference is made to your communication of 6 October 1945, concerning your son, the late Second Lieutenant Norman J. Rogers, Jr., who has been reported killed in action on 24 August 1944, in Germany.

I fully appreciate the sorrow you have experienced since you were advised of your son's death and your desire to secure additional information regarding the circumstances under which his death occurred is most understandable. I regret that no further information has been received regarding the particulars of Lieutenant Rogers' death since the official report transmitted to the War Department stating that he had been killed in action on 24 August 1944. I am sorry that the conditions of warfare often denied to the families of our military personnel, the comfort of knowing the complete facts surrounding the loss of their loved ones. However, you may be assured that, in the event, further news regarding Lieutenant Rogers is received, you will be notified promptly.

Since The Quartermaster General of Washington, D. C., has jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the burial of our military personnel who die overseas, I am forwarding a copy of your letter to that official requesting that you be advised regarding the manner by which your son's remains were identified and of available information concerning the location of his grave and burial.

You, and the other members of Lieutenant Rogers' family, have my heartfelt sympathy in the grief occasioned by the irreparable loss of your gallant son and I trust that, in the days to come, the knowledge that he served honorably and faithfully in his country's cause and the cherished memories you have of him may be a source of comfort to you in your bereavement.

We are in receipt of your letter of October 4th pur-
porting to be an official report of the death of our son, Lt. Norman J. Rogers, Jr.
This report marks the date of our son's death as August 24, 1944 and his
manner of death as "killed in action over Germany".

It may be an official report but it is not a true one. We accepted
your presumptive date temporarily because we already knew the true facts
concerning his death and we expected that when all the facts were made
known to you, we would be notified but we refuse to accept this notifica-
tion from you and ask for further investigation.

The true facts are as follows:- Our son was the pilot of his crew,
which consisted of nine members. On their August 24th mission, the whole
crew parachuted to earth safely after their ship was disabled. On land-
ing they were taken captive by German guards. One, having been wounded
was taken to a hospital and the other eight started for a prison camp.
Two days later, on August 26th 1944, they were attacked by German civilians
in Russelsheim, Germany. Two escaped after the attack but the other six
were killed.

Their murderers were tried in court and the bodies of the six airmen
were found in a mass grave. Four were identified. The two unidentified
were our son and his bombardier-navigator. There is no reason why positive
identification cannot be established by fingerprinting the boys.

You know now why we cannot accept your report on our son's death and
we ask that necessary steps be taken toward his identification that we may
have a true report on his death and above all, a known location of his
grave.

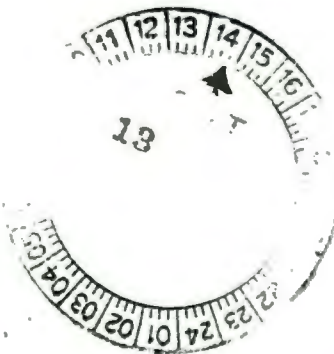

This is in reply to your recent letter regarding your husband,
Second Lieutenant Norman J. Rogers, Jr.

Your desire to learn the full details of his heroic sacrifice is well understood. As has been reported to you, your husband was first reported missing in action on 24 August 1944 over Germany. You were regretfully informed by letter dated 25 August 1945, that an official finding of death had been recorded for your husband under the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, approved 7 March 1942, as amended, and that the presumptive date of his death has been established as 25 August 1945. My letter of 4 October 1945, informed you that an official report had been received which states that your husband was killed in action on 24 August 1944 in Germany.

Our commanders in zones of occupation immediately upon entering their areas begin a search for information and facts concerning personnel who have been reported missing. This is done by interrogation of the inhabitants, examination of captured enemy records, and careful search of all parts of the surrounding territory. Facts not previously known are then reported to the War Department so that the next of kin may have information of their loved ones. Information that may change the status of missing personnel is often received, although the full details of the fatal action are not immediately available. It is difficult, and I know you will understand, that in battle where the movements of many ~~men~~^{men} and much equipment is over large areas, to immediately record all the numerous facts of each heroic deed.

A copy of your letter has been forwarded to the Quartermaster General, Washington 25, D. C., as that official has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to burial.

Permit me to extend my deepest sympathy to you in your great sorrow.

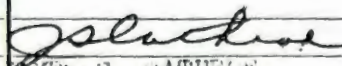

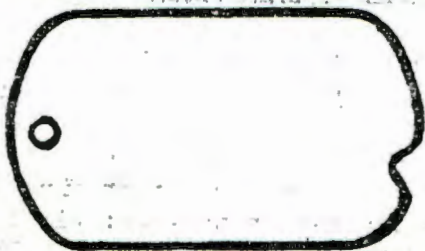

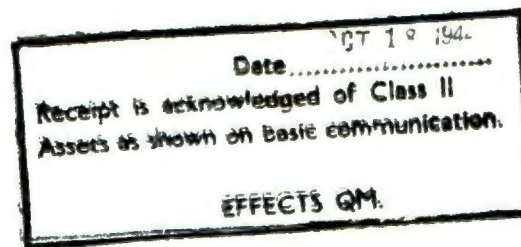
