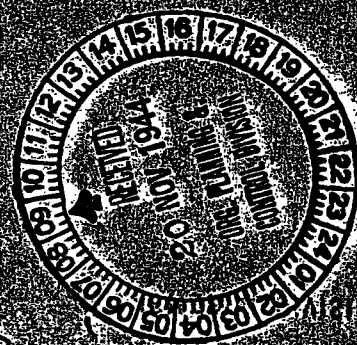

SYNOPSIS OF CASE : On 21 May 1943, a B-17 with a crew of 10 men, left England en route to bomb a target at Emden, Germany. The formation was attacked by about 60 enemy fighters over the Frisian Islands. Fighter attacks were discontinued while the bomb run was being made over the target where the flak was intense. After the bomb run, fighter attacks were resumed and it was at this time that the subject aircraft left the formation because of the resulting damage. Due to vigorous attacks and extreme battle conditions, definite observations could not be made and therefore, exact information as to the disappearance of this plane is unknown. There are several factors which lead to the conclusion that it was probably lost with all its crew members in the North Sea: 1) No word, official or unofficial, has ever been heard about the plane or any of its crew. 2) The possibility that it fell in enemy territory is discounted by the fact that there is no mention of the plane or crew in captured enemy records.

Reference is made to Remarks on reverse side of MACR and 3rd Indorsement from the unit, the 94th Bomb Group.

2. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.

3. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared unrecoverable.

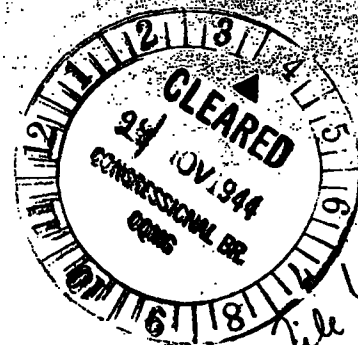

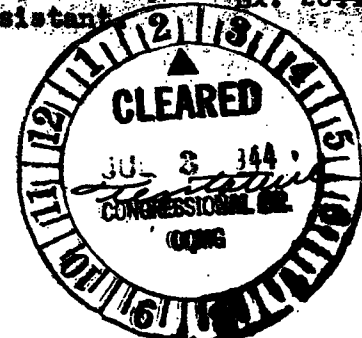

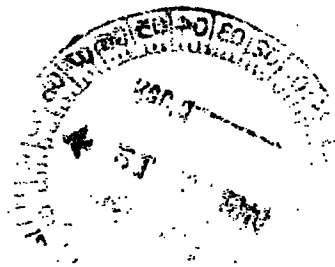
