

was last seen in the vicinity of Dartmoors. Body is being collected by
Harrowbeer from the police station at Princetown.

EXPLANATION OF PART A - CIVILIAN OR PRIVATE CEMETERY



1. When the remains are delivered for interment in a civilian or private cemetery, you are responsible for paying all interment expenses. In this connection, you are entitled to the allowance mentioned in paragraph 2 below.
2. An amount not to exceed \$75 is allowed by the government toward actual interment expenses when final interment of the remains is in a private or civilian cemetery. No allowance is authorized toward interment expenses when interment is in a national or post cemetery.
3. The \$75 maximum allowance by the government toward interment expenses includes but is not limited to the payment of one or more of the following items: hearse hire from the railroad station to your home, the funeral home, church, cemetery, or any other place designated by you; vault; church services; newspaper notices; transportation for friends and relatives to and from cemetery; and the services of a funeral director.
4. Reimbursement by the government is made only to the person who paid from his personal funds the expenses of or incident to interment in a private or civilian cemetery. Receipted bills are not required to accompany this form. Any expenses over and above the \$75 maximum must be borne by the person who incurred or paid the additional expenses.

EXPLANATION OF PART B - NATIONAL OR POST CEMETERY

1. When the remains are delivered to you at government expense prior to burial in a national or post cemetery, you are responsible for all additional expenses necessary to deliver the remains from that point to the national or post cemetery grave site. However, you may be entitled to an allowance for the cost of transporting the remains from your home to the national or post cemetery grave site subject to the conditions outlined in paragraph 2, below.
2. Reimbursement of transportation expenses is allowed only when the cost to the government to deliver the remains to you is LESS than what it would have cost the government to deliver the remains direct to the national or post cemetery of final interment. However, the amount which you may be allowed (the difference between cost of delivery to you and cost of delivery by the government direct to the national or post cemetery) may not exceed the amount actually expended by you to deliver the remains to the cemetery grave site. WHETHER OR NOT YOU WILL BE GRANTED AN ALLOWANCE IS DEPENDENT UPON AN AUDIT OF THIS REQUEST. IN ANY EVENT YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED OF ANY ALLOWANCE DUE YOU BY THE OFFICE TO WHICH THIS FORM IS SENT.

3. Reimbursement by the government will be made only to the person who paid from his personal funds for transporting the remains to the national or post cemetery grave site.

4. No interment expense allowance is authorized since interment is made ultimately in a national or post cemetery.







Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.

This replies to your letter of July 26, 1985, requesting information concerning the death of Lieutenant Foreman.

We have reviewed Lieutenant Foreman's individual deceased personnel file and have extracted the following information:

Second Lieutenant Jerome L. Foreman, 0-730438, was born November 18, 1921. He was assigned to the 78th Fighter Group and was the pilot of a P-38 aircraft. He died of multiple injuries received in an airplane crash on January 27, 1943, near Princetown, Devon, England. He was first buried in plot G, row 2, grave 14, United States Military Cemetery, Brookwood, England. At the request of his next of kin, mother, Mrs. Elizabeth Foremen, his remains were returned to the United States in June 1948, and reburied in Hillside Memorial Park, Los Angeles, California.

I hope this information will be helpful.

This responds to your letter of September 21, 1985, requesting additional information pertaining to Lt. Foreman.

The serial number of his aircraft was 42-2886. The mission departed Portreath January 22, 1943 for Torch. The remains were found March 1, 1943, 600 yards east of Broad Rock in Parish Lydford, Dartmoor, approached by way of Nuns Cross Farm, Princetown. The aircraft was destroyed by fire. The file does not state the squadron number of the 78th Fighter Group.

The Alfred F. Simpson Historical Research Branch, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama 36112, may be able to provide additional information. Include the information we have provided if you write to them for assistance.
