May - one half of camp open as purges

9 - newsroom opens

15 - music equipment arrives - Flying
Syncopaters form

20 - Klarion debut - Reference Library closed
Major Fagan says, "Home or home by Xmas"

25 - Tex Newton and "Sugar Blues" monopolize
"Sing Songs". Population 1853.

July 2 - "Orchestra Wives"

4 - no appell - Newton & Houston awaken
camp at 7:00 A.M.; All day sports program

Show.

6 - Col. Alkire gives the first "Tonite at 8:00"
- "D-Bars" at 40 pts - heat is spoiling

Food - Softball season starts

- 17 - Appell and calisthenics now held on athletic field
 - 18 - Barrel of Fun Show - 10 men go into 8 man rooms. Maj. Milleken pitches first no hitter
 - 21 - Optimism runs high as big break comes in W. Front.
 - 29 - Six repats leave the Compound
- Aug - 6 - Lt. Col. "Jonesy" appointed Athletic Director.
- 13 - Brig. Gen. Vanaman makes first visit
 - 19 - Seats in Theatre finished - "Happy Hr #1" "D-Bars" 50 pts
 - 18 - 163 wins American League Flag.
 - 19 - 170 wins National League Flag
 - 20 - 15.8 defeats 16.4 for the volleyball title
 - 23 - Softball season ends - no bats. "Dixie Dugan" movie.
 - 30 - tents are put up.
- Sept 4 - No appell - 165 wins Labor Day Calisthenics with "D-Bar" for every man in the block. North wins volleyball - South takes softball and track
- Sept 5 - "Corsican Brothers"

up to 80 pts

- 15 - Big letter day with 5,675 letters
- 29 - Reference Library closes
- 31 - Kriegies spend a quiet Halloween,
nobody removed the main gate.
- Nov 7 - Roosevelt sweeps the Compound.
- 12 - "D-Bars" are up to 130 pts. 9+10
men rooms become 12.
- 19 - Football season ends due to cold,
rain, & injuries. 158 + 165 tied.
- 21 - Radio Playhouse presents "The
Melodeers" for the 1st time.

- Nov 23 - "The Spoilers" plays as a "silent" movie. The Food Acco closes - no food
- 25 - 11 car loads of food arrive to supplement a supply that would only have lasted till the last wk of Dec.
- 28 - 2 men pass the repeat board.
- 30 - Cooks drag out food they have saved by skimping - Big Thanksgiving spreads
- Dec 3 - Reference Library closes. "D-Bars" are up to 200 pts.
5. - Four Red Cross Xmas parcels are included in a shipment that makes our reserve good for 10 wks at $\frac{1}{2}$ parcels.
- 8 - Reference Library opens with a new addition.
- 9 - Enough Xmas parcels arrive for a $\frac{7}{10}$ issue.
- 12 - Black-out paths are finished.
- 17 - Kriegies pick Apr 1st forend of war
- 19 - 61,190 cigarettes donated to Belleria
- 21 - Holiday Harmonies with an American Flag
- 23 - Xmas Parcels are passed out

25 - no appetit; turkey is excellent
31 - lights till 2:00 A.M., Population

Jan 1, 1945 - no appetit

- 15, "Big Red Team" starts to roll
18 - announcement that full parcels
will be issued for 2 wks starting Jan 22.
English Xmas parcels passed out, $\frac{1}{3}$
per man. Optimism soars with
an air raid on Breslau.
22 - Russian drive cuts off bread supply.
Orders come out to walk 10 kilometers per day.
starting tomorrow
25 - Stratton's news quote 42 miles
Come on Joe unquote - becomes
barracks password
27 - Adjutant's call blows at 2:15, on the
road at ~~2:35~~ 0035
28 - Marched 32 km. - 6 hr rest in open
air - well below freezing. Marching
again at 18:00

- 29 May the 1st 40-45 kms. arrived shelter at 1100 - marched 12 hrs with no sleep since 0915 on the 26 Jan. Approx $\frac{1}{2}$ our men (1000) made the complete march men straggling in here all day. Rumored 200 hospital cases near death - seems entirely plausible - no. of fatalities to date not known. ~~Many~~ ~~many~~ ~~many~~
 seem to be trying to climb hill. Expect to start 0800 tomorrow morning. Col. Akire fell out at about 20kms. - had hospital wagon to pick him up - the last 10km we had no wagon, men that fell out just had it - one man (at least) wounded when runaway horse started guards to shooting along the road. Got bread & oleo here - first ration
- 30 - Leaving here (moshaw) with 320 volunteers to help fill up south camp - leaving noon a.m. 18 Km march - shelter in barns. got bread & oleo first rations
- 31 - March 8 km to Spremberg, entrained 1600. ^{HOT BARLEY SOUP}
- Feb 1st - Issued meat, jam & bread on train.
- 2 - Pull onto siding after dark - looks like may be our camp - Men in cars have G.I's
- 3 - move into de lousing camp - rank moves out to get

the camp ready - getting food here - bread, cheese and potatoes - washed hands + face - first since 27 Jan

4 - Germans won't work Sundays - very crowded here but drawing food and fairly warm - water scarce

5 - Air raid today - rumored that the rest of W Comp is outside in cars Germans trying to speed up delousing + searching - leaving tonite

22 - Recovered notebook - lost 5 Feb in search - Came back to compound after 3 nites in barn for 2nd delouse. 51st buzz camp during air raid. Col. Huber says things will get worse before better - 1st mail arrives

24 - 51st buzz camp - fired upon by guard tower - 6 nos.

26 - Notified that last wk of parcels starts tomorrow mixture - Am stand, Canad, English St, Engd Am Xmas.

MAR 4 - No more kitchen fuel.

8 - Parcels in camp no knowledge as to how many. Cologne bridges falling down.

10 - Two gasb parcels per 12 men + regular $\frac{1}{2}$ parcel issue after exactly 7 days goon rations. Enuf parcels for approx 2 wks at $\frac{1}{2}$.

15 - Full parcels to start Monday 19th

17 - Showers

19 - Full parcels enter compound then leave again as

MARCH 20 1945 - Full parcels - some Brit. Xmas and Canadian - majority By & Am Reg.

APRIL 2 - Am "A" parcels - vit pills, onions peaches - nix marge, cheese, coffee
3 - First big mail call

9 - Move into new compound - Argentine bulk tents - big air show

10 - half parcels announced - Nurnemberg hospital

1 - cases pulling in

11 - Full parcels on again - bombing ring around camp. Full swing trading with G.I.'s.

15 - Seven language sign disappears

17 - Shoe repair begins to run nite + day

20 - Men move from tents to barracks and vice versa
^{Col Good takes over}

21 - Men arriving daily from Nurnberg - Adolph comes in - cigs come back from syndicate

25 - Soup is best we've ever had.

26 - Goon's announce we won't be moved

27 - Kriegies officially take over camp at 1500

28 - Rain - no rappell inside or out. Goon guard standing by under full backs ready to march at 2200

29 - Light machine gun fire heard at dawn - 2 women injured by stray bullet in

skirmish outside camp; Stars and Stripes
flies over Moosberg at 1240 -
