Dear Mrs. Graham:

We are desirous that you be furnished information regarding the burial of the remains of your husband, the late Sergeant Harold M. Graham.

The official report of burial discloses that his remains were originally buried in the Longuenesse British Military Cemetery, located at St. Omer, France, but were later disinterred by American Graves Registration Personnel and moved to a more suitable location. I am therefore gratified to inform you that the remains of your husband are now resting in Plot DD, Row 7, Grave 140, in the United States Military Cemetery Blosville, France.

This cemetery is located twenty-five miles southeast of Cherbourg, France, and is under the constant care and supervision of our government. You may be assured that the identification and interment have been accomplished with fitting dignity and solemnity.

The Department of the Army has been authorized to comply, at government expense, with the feasible wishes of the next of kin regarding final interment, here or abroad, of the remains of your loved one. Within the near future, our office will provide you with full information and solicit your detailed desires.
