


Timed beacon

2 U.S. NAVAL FLEETS IN THE  
CHANNEL - SO MANY SHIPS THAT IT  
WOULD SEEM (FROM 20,000') ONE  
COULD STEP FROM ONE SHIP TO  
ANOTHER WITHOUT PATTING A FOOT  
IN THE WATER -

BY MOVING IN THE SAME  
DIRECTION AS GUNFIRE FROM NAVY  
16 IN. GUNS, THE SHELLS WERE  
VISIBLE PASSING BELOW US AT THE  
HEIGHT OF THEIR TRAJECTORY. (A 16 IN.  
GUN HAS A RANGE OF ABOUT 20 MILES  
AS VIEWED FROM 20,000') IT IS  
NOT POSSIBLE TO IMAGINE THE HELL  
THAT WAS GOING ON BELOW - IN AERIAL  
WAREARE THERE IS A RELATIVELY SHORT  
TIME OF REALIZATION OF EXISTING  
DANGER, AT WHICH TIME YOU ARE TOO  
BUSY TO DWELL ON IT. THE HARD  
TIME IS BETWEEN MISSIONS WHEN

YOU HAVE TIME TO THINK ABOUT IT -  
BEFORE D-DAY IT HAD been  
EXPECTED THAT THE LUFTWAFFE  
WOULD PUT UP A MAXIMUM  
DEFENSE. TO THE CONTRARY THERE were  
NO GERMAN PLANES TO BE SEEN  
ON D-DAY - COASTAL DEFENSES  
HAD BEEN BUILT STURDILY FOR  
SOME TIME - WITH ALL OF THE FIREPOWER  
SUPPORTING THE INVASION, THERE  
WAS THE TERRIBLE REALITY THAT MEN  
ON THE GROUND HAD TO FACE  
TREMENDOUS ODDS AND LOSSES IN ORDER  
TO GAIN EVERY FOOT OF GROUND -  
THE MAJORITY OF THESE MEN WERE  
RELATIVELY UNTRAINED AND  
FACING ONE OF THE MOST  
FORDIDABLE MILITARY FORCES  
IN HISTORY. MANY WERE 18 yrs -  
OLDS OR very early 20's. THE  
COUNTRY HAD COME FROM  
PRACTICALLY A NON EXISTENT  
ARMY TO A TOTAL ARMED  
FORCES OF ABOUT 15 MILLION.  
IN 1937, IT WAS PROPOSED TO  
CONGRESS THAT 15 B-17s BE  
PROCURED - THE RESPONSE WAS THAT  
THIS WOULD BANKRUPT THE  
COUNTRY - AT THAT TIME A B-17  
COST ABOUT 150,000. IN WW II  
THE COUNTRY HAD TIME - TODAY  
THERE IS NO SUCH LUXURY - ALSO  
THERE WAS ONE SIMPLE MISSION  
THAT EVERYONE UNDERSTOOD -
