1. Abortives.

a. Airplane No. 42-31619 returned early because one of the waist gunners became ill.

b. Airplane No. 42-39943 returned early because the oil temperature regulator bypass valve on No. 3 engine became wedged in the open position causing the oil to flow around the jacket of the cooler thereby causing excessively high oil temperature. A high carburetor temperature was found to be caused by a short in the electrical circuit of the carburetor filter assembly by causing it to be in the on position.

c. Airplane No. 42-31037 returned early because the pilot observed liquid flowing from the trailing edge of the wing. Thinking it was a gasoline leak he feathered the engine to prevent fire. Ground Check showed the liquid to be glycol, coming from the heating system overflow.

2. Battle Damage.

a. 42-31662 - Small flak hole in leading edge of right wing. Small flak hole in bottom of fuselage.

b. 42-31891 - 2" flak hole in leading edge of right wing, cutting de-icer lines.

c. 42-97073 - 2" flak hole in bottom of right wing, inner panel.

d. 42-31091 - 3" flak hole in right side of No. 4 accessory cowl.

SUBJECT: Group Bombardier's Report, Mission of 1 May 1944.

TO : Commanding Officer, 401st Bomb Group, APO 557.

1. BOMBING APPROACH AND RUN: Upon reaching the I.P. it was found that the whole target area was covered with an overcast of 9-10/10 clouds. It was hoped that a break in the clouds would make it possible to bomb, however the undercast gave the group no opportunity to even make more than one check point. There seemed to be no indication of any change in cloud formation, hence, the bombs were held and the group returned to base.

2. DISPOSITION OF BOMBS: 21 A/C Loaded with 124 X 1000# M-44 Bombs took off for the mission. 5 A/C returned early and brought 118 X 1000# M-44 Bombs back to base. One of the aircraft passing over the target jettisoned 6 Bombs in the channel; the remaining aircraft returned all their bombs to base.

TARGET: The target is another of those types which most of you are now familiar with. This particular one has been designated one of eight(8) LARGE SITES and is of course one of the priority ones of the whole lot of them.

Your target area is roughly a right triangle in shape with sides to the right triangle being approx. 500 yards on the east to west line and approx 280 yards on the NNE--SSW and other side making the area quite a large target.

This time your target is not in a wooded area but is a built up area in the clear.

Altho- the exact nature of these targets have not been disclosed to us, recent information received indicates the necessity of bombing these targets out of existence is a very important one. A good bombing job with your bomb load should accomplish this necessity and also limit the number of trips to this area to a minimum.
