ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: (#1) LERBST, GERMANY (A/F)
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "B" Group. Two PFF were included in the lead squadron, with one in each of the other two. A spare accompanied the lead and high squadrons.

3. Flight Over England:
 - a. Takeoff:

On takeoff there was a very low ceiling at about 400', so the group climbed through the overcast and was on top at about 3,000' and in the clear. All ships took off successfully.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

Assemblies were good and made very fast. 94th "B" left the buncher on time but was short one ship in the high and one in the low. The spares were at the assembly. Although Cottessmore was departed on time the group was north of course.

c. Route Over England:

The two late ships pulled into formation before we reached the first turn. The route over England was almost as briefed except 94th "B" had to dodge third division groups forming on its course and at its altitude, 6000 ft. The group flew a little to the left of course to miss these coming groups. 94th "B" fell into wing formation before Pt. "D".

4. Attack:a. Flight to Target:

The route over the channel was as briefed. The group did one double drift to fall into its briefed # 8 position in the division column and this made it late at the control points. The division leader did a double drift, 94th "B" followed to keep from over running the group in front. "Buckeye Red" said the # 1 target was overcast so 94th "B" headed for # 2 target, which he said was overcast also. The group started the run from the IP of the primary target. Target # 2 was clear, but 94th "B" bombed in group formation since Buckeye Red had said that the target would be overcast and H2X bombing was anticipated.

b. Bombing Run:

Approximately forty-miles from the primary IP the Air Commander called that the group would bomb target No. 2 by H2X. The turn was made at the IP with all three squadrons in group formation. Cloud coverage was nil to 2/10 and the target city could be seen from the IP. The lead bombardier took over from the Mickey operator after two check points. The target city could be identified but the MPI and surrounding area was completely covered by smoke. Using visual reference points the cross hairs were placed on the MPI, bombs away at 1145. AFCE worked satisfactorily. The leader salvoed, all others used 140ft. intervalometer setting.

c. Flight from Target:

Was as briefed. 94th "B" bombed in group so there was no rally. It let down to 5000 ft. over Belgium.

d. Return to Base:

The group crossed in at 5000 ft. and held that altitude to the Division break up, where it continued to let down to 2000 ft. at the group breakup. All ships landed safely at home base.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)4. e. Weather:

Weather from continental coast was 8/10 to approximately 7° E, breaking up and becoming clear from Rhine River on into target. Substantially the same conditions prevailing on route back.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was excellent.

g. Comments on Formation and Interval:

Formation was good to the target. We had a good bombing formation at bombs away. The formation was rather scattered out loose from the target back to the base.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

All scheduled A/C attacked the target.

6. Enemy Opposition:

No enemy air or ground opposition seen or encountered.

9. Statistical Summary of Operations: (See attached form)10. Bombing Data:a. Observations:

From strike photos available patterns appear good but are approximately 2,000 feet short of assigned MPI. Target area considerable smoked up from bombs of preceding groups and accurate assessment difficult.

b. Disposition of Bombs:Lead Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked, dropping 72 x 500# RDX and 48 X 500# IB bombs. The spare returned 6 RDX's and 4 IB's to base.

10. b. Disposition of Bombs: (Cont'd)

Low Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the target, dropping 32 X 500# RDX and 48 X 500# IB bombs.

High Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the target, dropping 418 X 150# T-1, 6 X 500# RDX and 4 X 500# IB bombs. The spare returned 38 X 150# T-1 bombs to base.

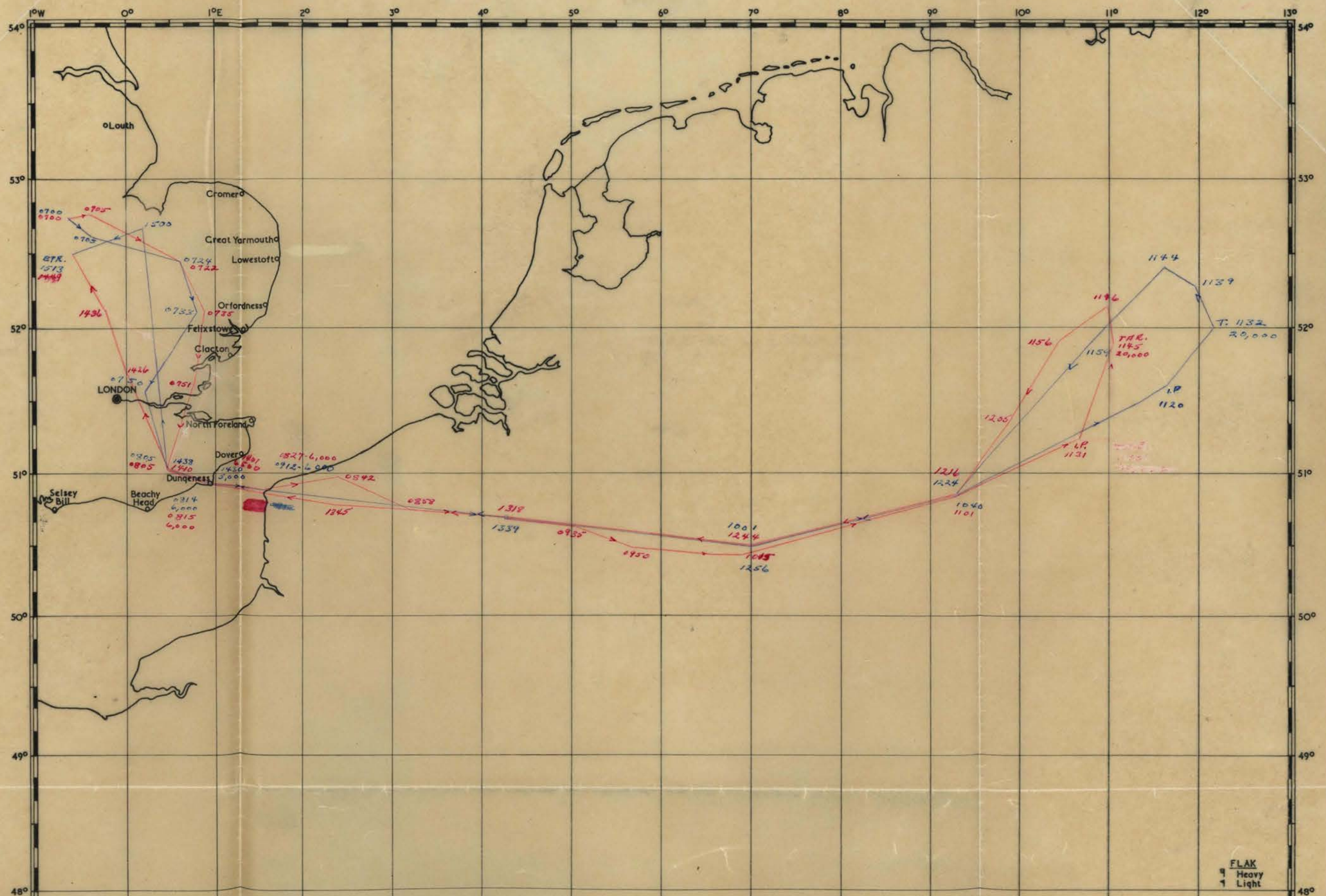
