ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: BOTDROP, GERMANY, (Vis)
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "C" Group. One GH A/C was borrowed from the 398th Group for the lead Squadron. A PFF A/C was included in each squadron, with a spare accompanying the lead and high squadrons.

3. Flight over England:
 - a. Takeoff:

Takeoff was as briefed with all scheduled A/C being airborne.
 - b. Squadron & Group Assemblies:

Assemblies were made good on Cottesmore Buncher and all ships were in formation when the group departed on time, on course.

Mission Summary Report (cont.)3. 6. Route over England:

The route over England was as briefed and Wing and Division assemblies were made good. 94 "C" was in proper #6 Division position before leaving the coast. Cromer was departed on time, on course.

4. Attack:a. Flight to Target:

The division was south of course on the route over the channel but the group managed to get back on course at the point just before the IP. Cloud cover was 10/10 so an instrument bombing run was started.

b. Bombing Run:

Before takeoff it was known the GH equipment was out of commission, so when "Buckeye" called 10/10 clouds over the target areas the group immediately proceeded to the # 4 priority target which was to be bombed by PFF. The bombing was done in group formation entirely by PFF, over a complete undercast. The three leads salvoed; all others dropped with a 75 ft. intervalometer setting. The AFCE was O.K. Results were unobserved.

c. Flight from Target:

Group was south of course after the target due to very strong winds and bombing south of the assigned target. Letdown was started over Belgium and the coast out was departed on course, practically on time.

d. Return to Base:

The lead of the group was turned over to the deputy as the Gee box was out in the lead ship and it was necessary to stay directly on course between London and the "diver" areas. Group made an instrument letdown on the buncher and all ships landed safely at home base.

5. Weather:

Weather upon penetrating continent was 10/10 stratus cumulus, tops approximately 9,000 feet, the same condition prevailing over target and on route back.

f. Fighter Support:

Good.

g. Comments on Formation & Interval:

Formation very good and interval was good..as briefed.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

A/C 42-97664 - No credit. Returned early with internal failure of #3 engine.

A/C 44-6146 - Credit. When the bomb-bay doors were opened at the IP the bombs accidentally released themselves.

6. Casualties: 1 - LIA

7. Enemy Oppositions:

No air nor ground opposition was encountered (See Flak Report for Flak)

9. Statistical Summary of Operations: (see attached form)

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Due to complete undercast, results were unobserved. It may be that the town of Wippertal was bombed, not Essen - plots indicate such.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

Of the 13 A/C sorties, 12 EET and bombed the secondary target, dropping 70 X 500# RDX, 72 X 500# GP and 24 X 100# M47 IB bombs. The abortin A/C 664 returned 12 RDX and 2 IB's to base.

Low Squadron:

All 12 A/C EET and bombed the secondary target, dropping 121 RDX, 14 GP and 22 100# IB bombs. A/C 322 had an A-4 release malfunction and returned 8 RDX and 2 IB bombs to base..having expended 4 RDX on the target.

High Squadron:

Of the 13 A/C EET, 12 bombed the secondary target, dropping 60 X 500# RDX, 82 X 500# GP and 24 X 100# IB bombs. A/C 145 had its bombs fall out when the bombbay doors were opened at the IP -- thereby expending 1 RDX, 11 GP and 2 IB bombs. A/C 132 had 1 GP hang up which it returned.

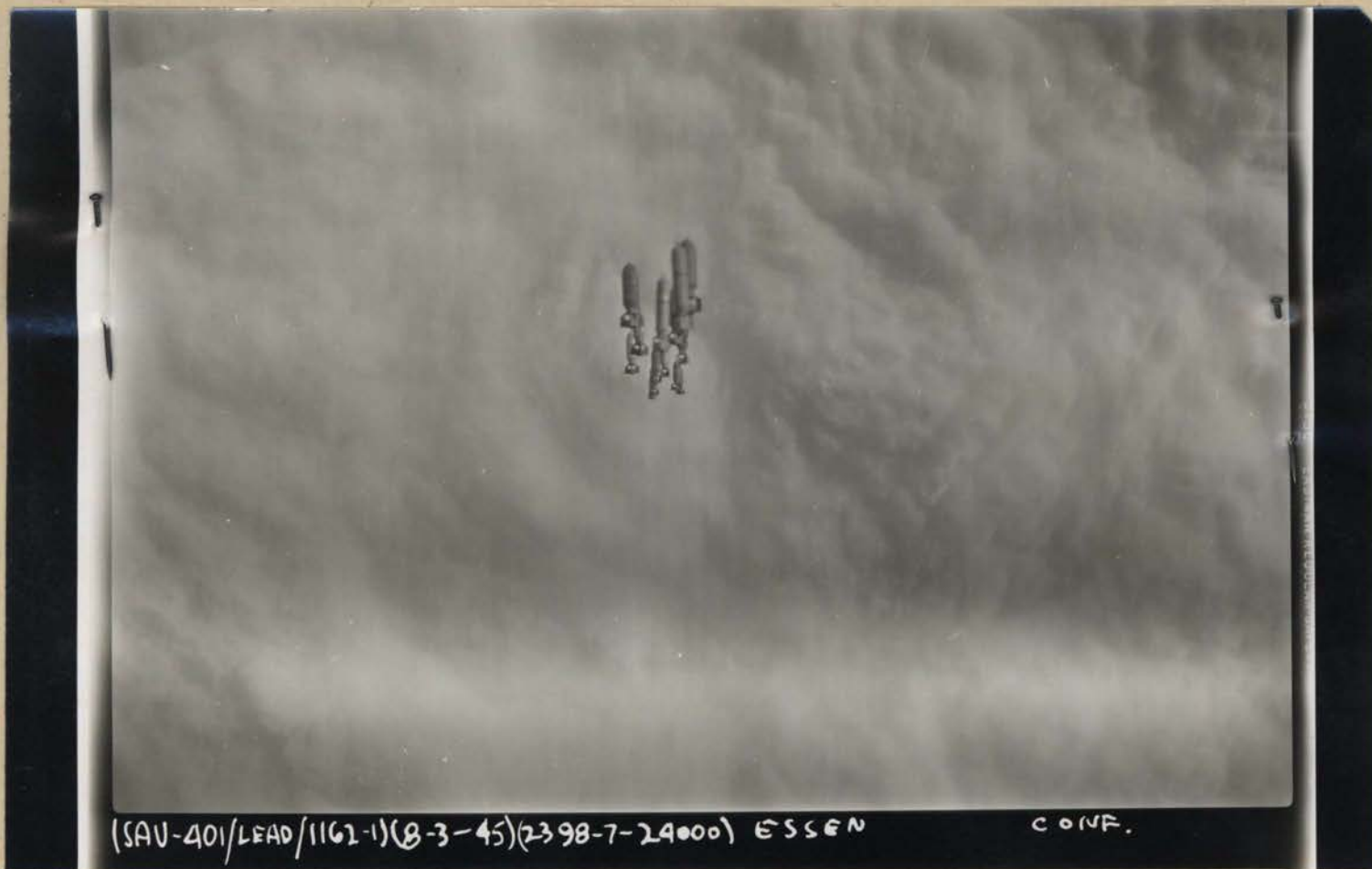

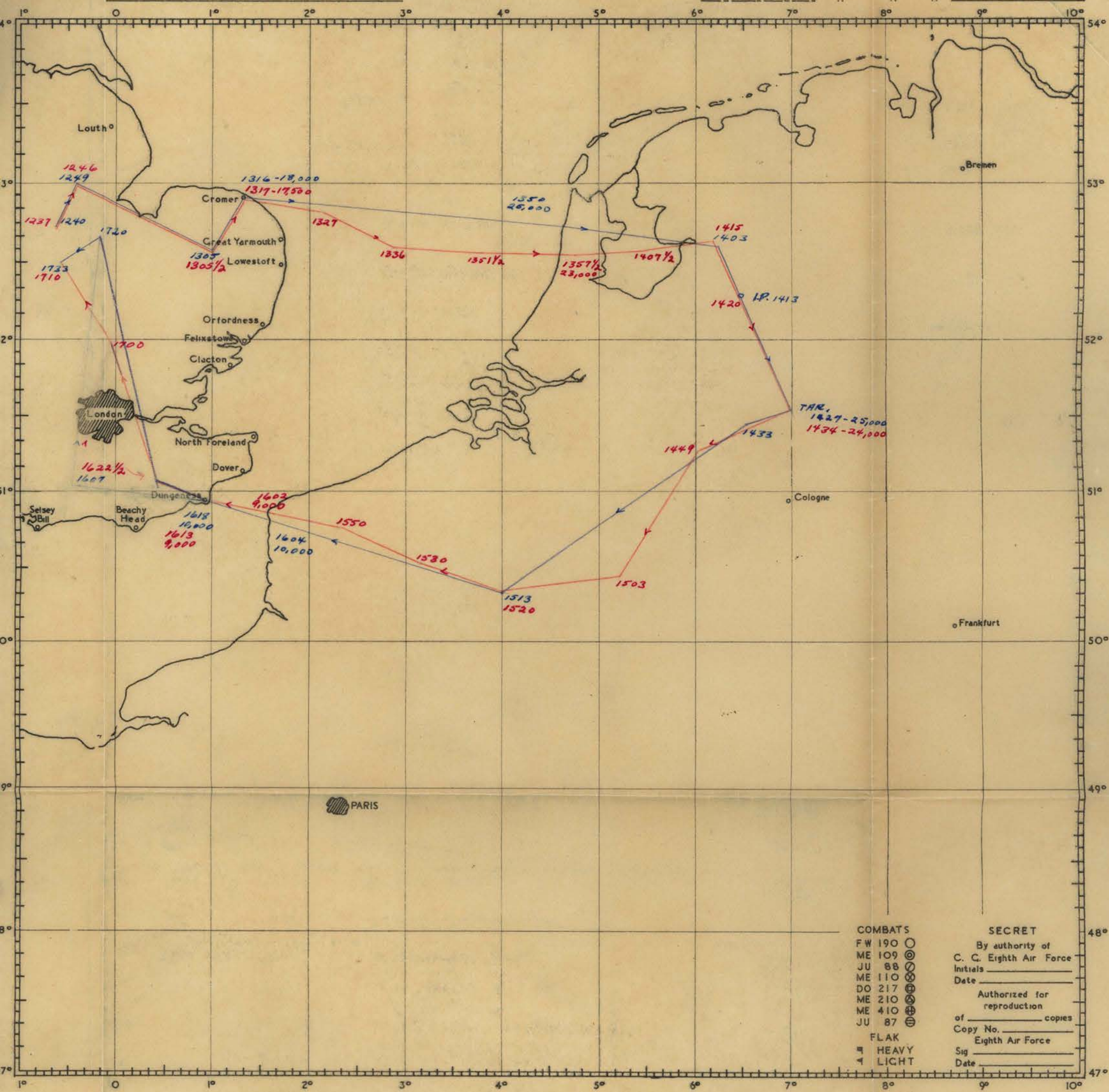

31. Reasons for Failure to Attack:

A/C 42-97664 - No Credit. Returned early after # 3 engine started running rough and the oil pressure went up to about 95 P.S.I., then started to drop off. When the pressure reached 45 R.S.I. he feathered the propeller. At the same time the oil pressure started to drop, oil vapor started coming from the crankcase breather. Ground inspection revealed that both oil control and compression rings were on the magnetic sump plug. Metal filings were found on the cuno.

A/C 44-6146 - Credit. When the bomb bay doors were opened at the IP, the bombs fell out. Equipment checked out satisfactorily on the ground-possible short in airplane.
