1. Assigned Target: HEILBRONN, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "A" Group. Two GH A/C were borrowed from the 303rd Group, one each for the lead and high squadrons. A PFF A/C was included in each of the lead and low squadrons, and a spare accompanied each squadron.

3. Flight Over England:
- a. Takeoff:

Takeoff was normal in clear visibility -- all ships took off successfully. Cloud layers were encountered at about 1050 feet.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

Assemblies were made rapidly -- the Air Commander wanted to leave early. Cottesmore buncher was departed three minutes early, on course, with full formation.

c. Route Over England:

94th "A" continued to gain time due to wind differential, hence, after reaching point "E" about ten minutes early a large double drift was accomplished to lose time. Coming back to C. P. # 1, 94th "A" was in proper division position. Coast was departed on time, on course.

4. Attack:a. Flight to Target:

The flight to the IP was as briefed, timings being made a little early due to winds. About 4 minutes before IP the lead aircraft had to feather # 4 engine, hence in order to stay in formation it salvoed its bombs on Goppingen. The deputy took over and made a normal PFF run on the target.

b. Bombing Run:

The cloud cover was about 6 - 8/10's so the group went in and bombed by squadrons, in trail, and attempted visual assists. The high squadron went in first and made a GH run, bombing at 1438. The Lead squadron followed them in and bombed at 1440 on a straight PFF run. The Low squadron came in last. They bombed at 1441 $\frac{1}{2}$ , making a PFF run also. None of the 3 lead bombardiers could give any visual assistance but all three had good rate angles set up and thought the instrument runs were excellent. No equipment malfunctions were reported. Results were unobserved.

c. Flight From Target:

The flight from the target was as briefed-- group and wing rally being accomplished at about 1534. No flak was encountered and the group started its letdown over France.

d. Return to Base:

The English Coast was reached near Beach Head and all squadrons proceeded home in a normal manner. One aircraft landed away -- all others returned safely to base.

e. Weather:

Weather was described as 10/10's overcast until reaching Rhine River at which point it was clear, then becoming 4/10 to 6/10's. Weather over target area was approximately 6/10's, although solid cloud layer obscured primary target.

4. f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was described as good.

g. Comments on Formation:

Generally good.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

A/C 43-37602 and A/C 44-6313. Credit. Bombs were released accidentally when bomb bay doors were opened. There was a mechanical malfunction in the bombardier's toggle switch, in both cases. The push button, in the toggle switch, evidently remained depressed after the ground pre-flight. That completed the gap in the circuit, so that when the bomb-bay doors were opened, completing the final gap in the circuit, the bombs went out. The small spring, under the push button is in a housing too large for the size of the spring, allowing the spring to slip to one side and does not reposition the button.

6. Enemy Opposition:

No enemy air or ground opposition was encountered.

7. Battle Damage: None.

8. Casualties: None.

9. Statistical Summary of Operations: (See attached form)

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Due to partial undercast no satisfactory observations of results could be made, however, some crews report observing fires through momentary break in clouds.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

Of the 12 scheduled A/C ten attacked the secondary target by PFF dropping 71 X 500# RDX, 8 X 500# GP and 40 X 500# IB bombs. GH A/C 592 could not keep up with formation, hence, made a run on Gepingen and dropped 4 GP's, 3 RDX's, and 4 IB's. A/C 602 had 8 RDX and 4 IB bombs drop accidentally when doors were opened at IP. The spare returned 8 GP and 4 IB to base.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)10. b. Disposition of Bombs (Cont'd)Low Squadron:

Of the 12 A/C EET, eleven bombed the secondary target, dropping 87 X 500# RDX and 44 X 500# IB bombs. A/C 313 accidentally released its bombs near the IP -- dropping 8 RDX and 4 IB bombs. The spare returned 8 RDX and 4 IB to base.

High Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the primary target (GH), dropping 11 X 500# GP, 84 X 500# RDX and 48 X 500# IP. The spare returned 8 RDX and 4 IB to base.





Credit. Bombs were released accidentally when bomb-bay doors were opened. There was a mechanical malfunction in the bombardier's toggle switch, in both cases. The push button, in the toggle switch evidently remained depressed after the ground pre-flight. That completed the gap in the circuit, so that when the bomb-bay doors were opened, completing the final gap in the circuit, the bombs went out. The small spring, under the push button is in a housing too large for the size of the spring, allowing the spring to slip to one side and does not reposition the button.

2. Lt. Richard H. Steele, pilot A/C 947, stated that Deputy of Low Squadron was out of formation quite frequently.

3. Lt. James A. Nolan, pilot A/C 993, said chaff was not discharged as briefed, but was thrown out at odd times.

4. Capt. James F. Goodman, pilot A/C 125, stated that open truck came over to Molesworth to transport crew back to this base. In view of cold weather, he believed that a covered truck could have been sent instead.

## BRIEFING NOTES (1 March 1945)

PRIMARY---HEILBRONN--This is a medium sized Railway Traffic center with a fairly large M/Y which is the shape of a "Bow-Tie" and whose N-S axis is 3,250 yards in length. The usual components of a M/Y are within the target area but your MPI lies on the Sorting Sidings where good bombing will do the most damage. With your intervalometer setting of 80 feet your pattern should amply cover these Sidings if your bombing is good. Control center of traffic from Stuttgart to Berlin, Nuremberg to Karlsruhe, and Nuremberg to Mannheim.

SECONDARY----H2X bombing on the same MPI.

LAST RESORT-----PFORZHEIM--Another Marshalling Yard which is long and narrow, running generally East to West--approx 3000 yards long and only 300 yards wide. MPI is right in the center of it on the main Passenger station, and where good bombing would effectively disrupt traffic and at same time amply cover some of the city--of 80,000 inhabitants--considering your 80 ft. intervalometer setting.

TARGETS OF OPPORTUNITY-----Must be EAST of 0820E.

FRIENDLY ACTIVITIES: 2nd A.D. departs first with 340 aircraft and are bombing an A/D, two A/C component parts and a Marshalling Yard. Orange pins indicate the locations of their targets.

3rd A.D. goes out second with 360 aircraft and all of their effort is concentrated on large Marshalling yard at Ulm. Indicate with Marker.

Besides the one other group(1st "O") on our target, there will be 10 other 1st A.D. Groups bombing five other targets which are indicated by the RED pins. Four of these are M/Y's and one is an aircraft component factory.

OUR TARGETS, TAKEN INDIVIDUALLY, ARE NOT AMONG THE BIG MARSHALLING YARDS OF GERMANY, BUT COLLECTIVELY THEY FORM A VERY IMPORTANT SERIES OF CHOKING POINTS ON THE ENEMY'S SOUTHWESTERN FRONT. GOOD BOMBING ON THESE TARGETS WILL AT LEAST PARTIALLY PARALYZE HIS RAIL MOVEMENT AND WILL ALSO PARTIALLY CANCEL HIS RECOVERY FROM THE RESULTS OF OUR BOMBINGS IN THE AREA JUST TO THE EAST ON THE 23 OF February.

FIGHTER ESCORT: Six(6) 24 aircraft P-51s Groups assigned to 1st AD. Pick up bombers at 4815-0727E and two of these Groups are assigned to ~~the~~ cover five Groups of bombers--one of the five being the 401st. Enemy fighter reaction can be expected but deeper penetration of 2nd and 3rd divisions will more likely draw them.
